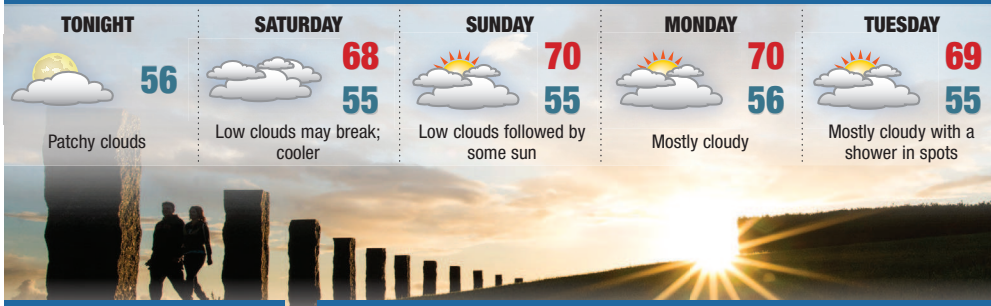

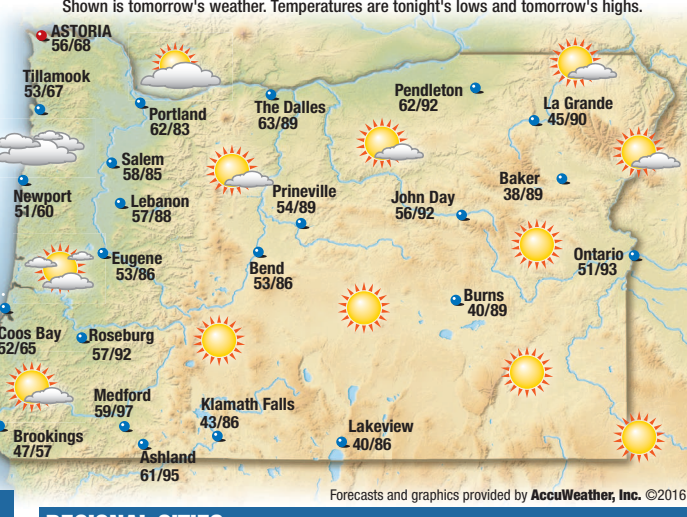

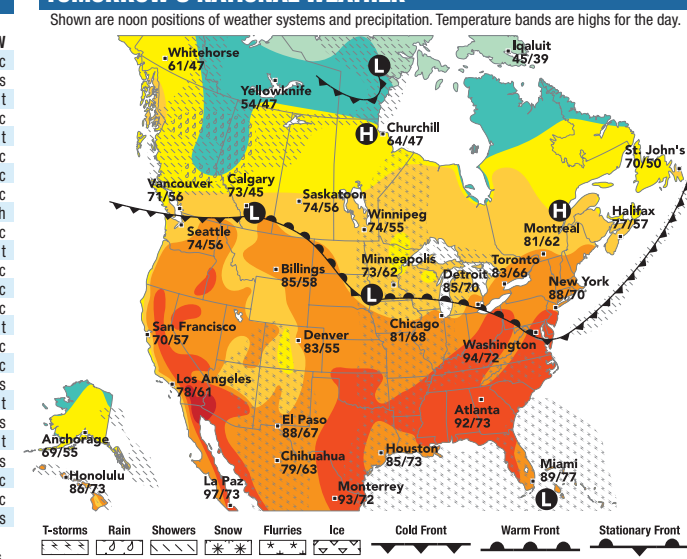

She attended Pacific Lutheran College in Tacoma, Washington, for two years and then attended Emanuel Hospital School of Nursing from 1948 through 1951.

Phyllis was an avid gardener and a member of many bridge clubs. She was a lifelong reader who participated in several book clubs. Survivors include her son, John Cushing and his wife, Kayleen; her daughter, Julie Cushing and her lifetime partner, Michelann, of Portland; and her sister, Evelyn McConnell of Fresno, California. She had many nephews and nieces, whom she dearly loved. Her brother, Orville Nygaard, and sister Muriel Brown, preceded her in death.

After graduating in 1951, Phyllis worked at Seattle's Virginia Mason Hospital from 1951 to 1953. She moved to Salem and worked at Salem Hospital from 1953 to 1955. Phyllis met her husband, Jack, on Memorial Day weekend. They married on Jan. 7, 1956.

Services will be held at Queen of Peace Catholic Church in Salem Aug. 31 at 11 a.m. A reception at the church will follow the service. Interment will be at Willamette National Cemetery Sept. 1 at 12 p.m., in Portland, where she will rest next to her husband.

Phyllis was active in the community of Salem as a member of Queen of Peace Catholic Church, the Sons of Norway and the Salem Assistance League. She started the Table of Plenty food bank at the church, and was an active board member of the PEO in Salem.

Herbert Jerald 'Jerry' Lange Astoria

June 8, 1930 — Aug. 13, 2016



Four bells to Radioman 2nd Class (E5), Herbert Jerald "Jerry" Lange, who passed away on Saturday, Aug. 13, 2016, of cancer. Jerry was born and raised in Salem, Oregon, and attended North Salem High School. From 1947 to 1951, he served in the U.S. Navy on the USS Princeton in the Pacific theater before and during the Korean War, and participated in the evacuation of U.S. citizens from China in 1948. He finished his tour of duty in Bremerton, Washington. In the Navy, he honed his skills in electronics and found the world of ham radio (K7KPT).

System (Army MARS) for over 35 years. From 1994 to 1996, Jerry was the Oregon state director for Army MARS.

In 1951, Jerry returned to Salem to begin an apprenticeship as a printer at the Oregon Statesman newspaper (later called the Statesman Journal), and worked there until 1982. During his apprenticeship, he met and married Barbara Jean Pace in April 1953 at Jason Lee Methodist Church in Salem, Oregon.

He was a member of the National Maritime Historical Society. His love of dancing drew him to become a member of "R Square Ds." Jerry was an accomplished ski instructor at Mount Hood with the Inlander JCs until 1983. He also visited Germany on three occasions to visit long lost, but found relatives.

In retirement, Jerry took a position as armed security for an armored car company in the Portland area. Later he moved to Scappoose, then to Astoria with his 60-foot sailboat, Gallant Lady, which he owned from 1994 to 2014. In Astoria he served with the Coast Guard Auxiliary in both the Astoria Flotilla 64, and later for a short time with the Cape Disappointment Flotilla 62. Through his friendship with Cmdr. Gordon Holsinger, he became a member of the American Legion at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, in 2007.

Jerry is survived by his sister, Barbara M. Lange of Portland, Oregon; daughter Katherine Lange of Pendleton, Oregon; daughter and son-in-law Rebecca Lange and David Valentine of Boise, Idaho; son Jon Lange of Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin; granddaughter Jennifer R. "JR" Lange of Dallas, Wisconsin; granddaughter Caryn Lange of Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin; grandson Joshua Lange of Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin; and his first wife, Barbara J. Lange of Salem, Oregon.

His hobbies and interests included amateur ham radio, sailing, alpine skiing, photography, square dancing and steam trains. Jerry was affiliated with the Army Military Affiliate Radio

A memorial service will be held on Tuesday, Aug. 30, 2016, at 11 a.m. at the Columbia River Maritime Museum's Barbey Center, 1792 Marine Drive in Astoria, with a reception following.

A committal ceremony with military honors will be held on Wednesday, Aug. 31, at 12:30 p.m. at Willamette National cemetery in Portland, Oregon.
