Richard Stanley Paskow
Warrenton
May 17, 1922 — Aug. 17, 2016



Richard Stanley Paskow, a Warrenton resident of 20-plus years, passed away peacefully on Aug. 17, 2016, at the age of 94. He was born in Boston, Massachusetts, on May 17, 1922, of immigrant parents, Joseph Paskow (Russia) and Sophia Olszowa (Poland). Richard had two sisters, Florence and Irene, and two brothers, Chester and baby Paskow. All have passed previously.

Richard grew up, lived and worked in Massachusetts and the New England area for over 50 years. During this time, he had many different types of jobs that taught him different trades. He worked for the government under President Roosevelt's Civilian Conservation Corps, the Goodyear Rubber Co., Trimet Tool Co., Darwood Body & Truck Co., George Lane Company and Rockland Manufacturing Co. In addition, Richard worked nights at a local Irish pub in Boston. He not only bartended, but did the specialty cooking — Irish stew, corned beef and cabbage and his famous spare ribs.

Richard also served in the U.S. Army for over three years during World War II.

Richard married Frances Eileen Dwyer in 1948, bought a house, and lived in Littleton, Massachusetts, while raising their two children, Richard Alan and Danielle Elaine. He loved his family and did his best to support each member. He eventually moved out

Oregon to be with his daughter, Danielle. He was very involved in his daughter's life and with his two grandsons, Michael and Ian.

Richard was always busy fixing things or doing new projects around the house in Warrenton. In his earlier years, he loved to bowl, go fishing, play poker, watch sports on TV and cook. He was a member of the Elks Club and an avid animal lover. He loved the outdoors, and was always planting and grooming the landscape. He was on a fixed income, but always found enough money to donate to foundations, such as the Humane Society, American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, Wounded Warrior Project, Red Cross and the American Cancer Society.

Anyone who knew Richard loved him for his unique sense of humor, his giving nature and his loving heart. He will be dearly missed by his family and friends. He leaves behind his loving daughter, Danielle, and two grandsons, Michael and Ian, here in Oregon. He also leaves behind his son, Richard, and his two grandsons, Jeremy and Matthew, who reside on the East Coast.

There will be a small service at the Ocean View Cemetery grave site in Warrenton on Wednesday, Sept. 14, 2016, at 3 p.m.

Chad's favorite thing to do was to "go fish-

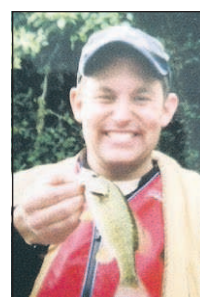
