At the Clatsop County Fair, 4-H Club members received several awards when they competed with their dogs. Champion Junior Division Dog Showman went to Daisy Taggart and her dog, Tootles, of Classy Canines Dog Club. Taggart also won the trophy in the active Agility Competition.

Taking the Rally Obedience top spot was Candice Kerr and Jammer. She was also the Grand Champion Dog Showman, and tied with Rynne Sunnell for the Top Dog and Handler combination trophy. Sunnell and her dog, Anna, won the Top Senior Obedience team.

Dalton Smith and his Great Dane, Daisy, won Top Intermediate Obedience Team, and were selected as Reserve Grand Champion Dog Showman. Kenneth Schlink and his canine, Buddy, were awarded Top Junior Obedience Team and Champion Junior Division Dog Showman.

Joseph Newton and his dog Buddy took Top Novice Obedience Team honors. Gage Vaughn, a first year member who joined with his puppy, Ruby, late in the year, earned red ribbons for their efforts in Showmanship and Rally. Celeste Kerr and her senior dog, Splash, showed in Advanced Rally as exhibition only.

Dog Judging is a domain dominated by Candice Kerr, an eighth grader in the Paws N' Action Dog Club, for the last five years. This year she again took top honors in the Intermediate/Senior division. Schlink, a first year member with the club, won the Novice/Junior division of Dog Judging.

Kerr and Smith also competed at the 2016 Oregon State Fair Aug. 20. Smith showed his Dane, Daisy, in the Graduate Novice Obedience class, winning top honors and champion. Kerr and her Labrador, Jammer, competed in the Advanced Graduate Novice Obedience and won the championship in that class.
