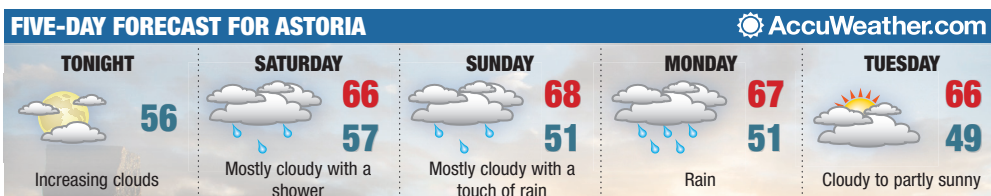

Columbia River season now extended for hatchery Chinook

Hatchery Chinook salmon, from Buoy 10 upstream to the Warrior Rock/Bachelor Island, can be kept through Thursday. The season extension for recreational fishing was recently approved by fishery managers from Oregon and Washington state because of catch rates being lower than expected. This action also extends the ongoing

hatchery-only Chinook season from Tongue Point upstream to Warrior Rock. Both sections of the river are scheduled to reopen to any Chinook again Oct. 1. During this extension all wild fish must be released unharmed. The daily adult bag limit is two salmonids a day, one Chinook and one hatchery steelhead.
