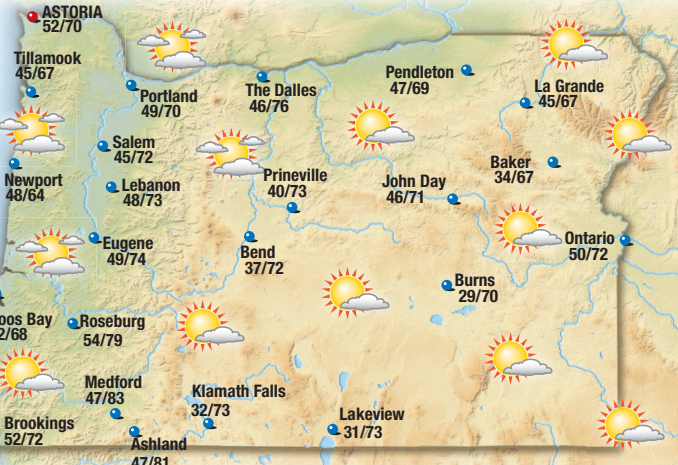

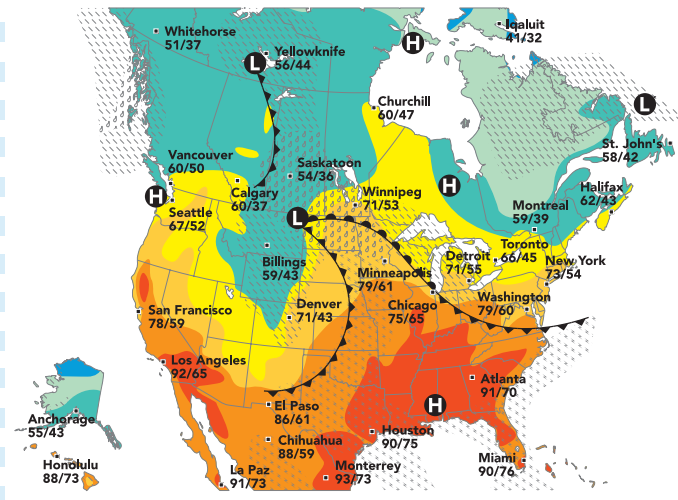

No one knew how to "Make the Best Better" (the 4-H motto) like Susan Marie (Amundsen) Parr, who passed away on Sept. 16, 2016. Her service to Pierce County 4-H and many other organizations is legendary, and she will be well missed by many.

Susan was born in 1941 in Astoria, Oregon, to Bernard and Johanna Amundsen. Growing up with sister Bernice, she learned many practical skills in the 4-H youth program. After graduating from Astoria High School, she earned a bachelor of arts degree in education at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington. She participated in the International 4-H Youth Exchange program to the Philippines. Later, as a substitute teacher at Sheridan Elementary in Tacoma, Susan met Terry Parr, whom she married in 1965.

When daughter Carol was born, Susan began her extensive volunteer career. Her roles ranged from volunteer, coordinator, educator, judge and mastermind for Valley 4-H Club (and 4-H at all levels), Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Riverside Grange, the Make It With Wool Contest, Clothing and Textile Advisors, and other groups. She taught agriculture at the Puyallup Fair School for more than 25 years and taught dozens of kids to sew each year. Susan's legacy of creativity, volunteering and leadership will live on

in the countless people she mentored in the last 40 years. Susan's can-do attitude, reliability and attention to detail made her a backbone in all of her volunteer communities.

Susan's travels spanned the globe, and she enjoyed chaperoning youth events. She loved spending time with her extended family, and later her grandchildren. Susan is survived by daughter Carol (Parr) Park, son-in-law Sean Park, and granddaughters Sarah and Johanna Park of Tacoma; sister Bernice Pearson of Longview; sister-in-law Diane Parr of Tacoma; and many extended family members.

Susan's was a life of service and a life of faith. She valued education, quality, hard work, respect, creativity, perseverance and tradition.

A memorial service will be held at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Tacoma on Saturday, Oct. 1, at 2 p.m.
