## Boater education course set for early October

ILWACO, Wash. — A mandatory Boater Education Class, leading to a boater education card in both Oregon and Washington, is being offered by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 62 in partnership with the Oregon State Marine Board from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Oct. 8 in the second floor conference room at the Port of Ilwaco, 165 Howerton Ave. Class registration starts at 7:45 a.m.

The cost for the class is \$10, and includes the class manual and materials. The course covers practical boating safety information and

local boating rules and regulations, cold-water survival and tips and techniques for making boating more enjoyable.

Students who pass the course can apply for a boater education card, which is required by Oregon and Washington's mandatory boater education program. In both states, all boaters age 12 and older must carry a boater education card when operating power boats greater than 10 horsepower.
