# Corps seeks comment on new road

WARRENTON — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is taking comments on the construction of a road for a subdivision in Warrenton. Adam Svensen, owner of

North River Homes, wants to extend Willow Drive south to an access road to be built from Willow Drive to 19th Street, just south of the North Coast Youth Correctional Facility. The project would impact approxi-

mately 0.54 acres of wetland. The project would provide a secondary access road to the existing Forest Rim subdivision, which is required for fire safety. The Corps is taking comments through Oct. 27.
