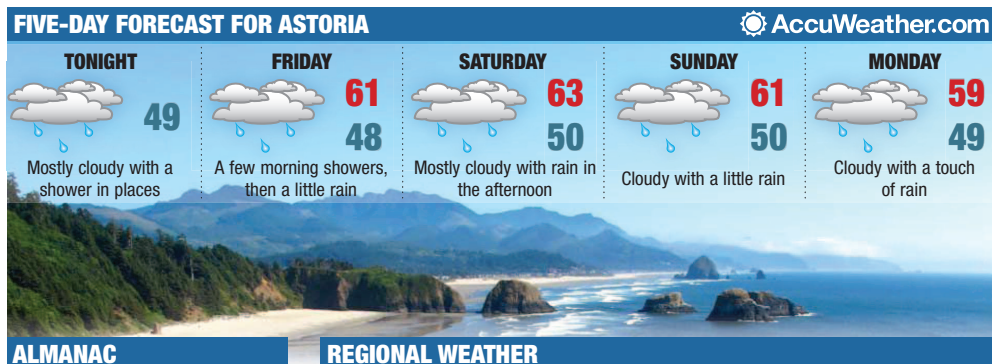

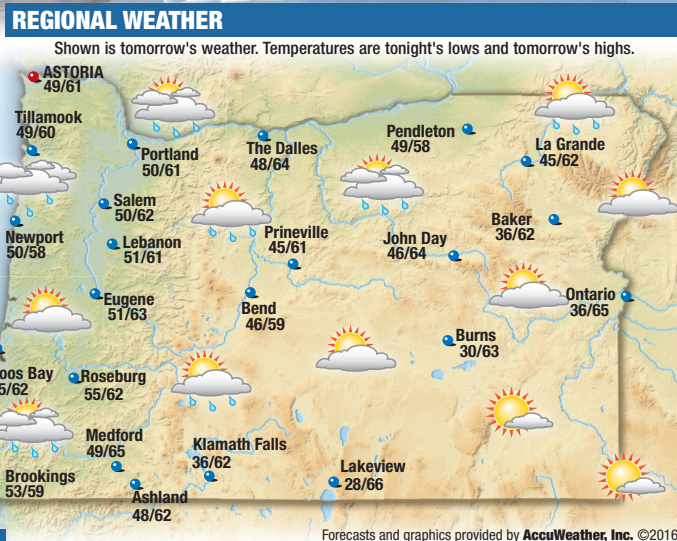

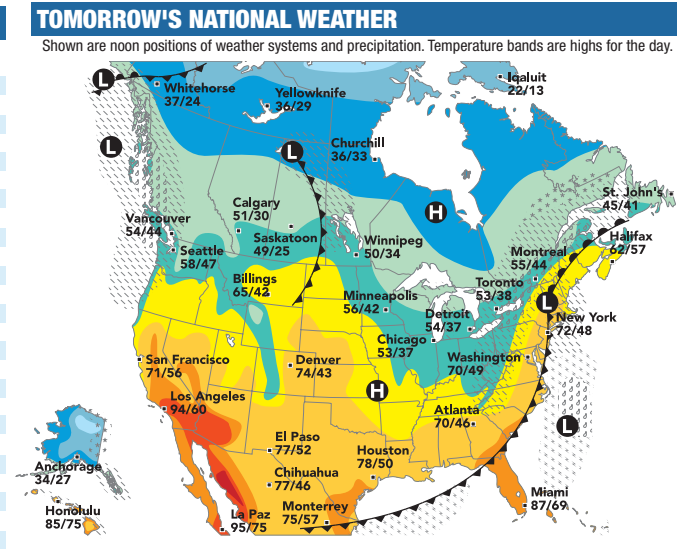

OBITUARY

Carl F. Peters

Manzanita

March 18, 1923 — Oct. 12, 2016



Carl F. Peters was born in Enosburg Falls, Vermont, on March 18, 1923, and died at home in Manzanita, Oregon, at the age of 93, on Oct. 12, 2016.

Carl joined the U.S. Army Air Corps in January 1942 and was honorably discharged in February 1946. He served as a weather observer in the China Burma India Theater. For a man who later in life refused to fly, this was quite an assignment.

Carl married his wife, Ione Harwood, while still in the Air Corps. They had four children, Marsha (Tom) Eiguren, Susan Hodge, Mike Peters (Kathleen) and Joan Morisky (Steve). Carl had eight grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. His wife, Ione, and daughter, Marsha, preceded Carl in death.

Carl made the journey from Vermont to Manzanita and Manzanita to Vermont countless times in his life. If Carl was taking his family, he drove to Vermont, and in later years he took the train. The trips to Vermont meant he brought home lots of maple sugar candy and real maple syrup, which he gave away as gifts.

Almost every trip was accompanied by a side trip to Montreal. There he would visit Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal and honor Brother Andre. He was actually at Mount Royal with family when Brother Andre became a saint.

Carl's early life in Vermont was spent living with two or three families, the last family being the Pfanstiels, whose son, Neil, would babysit Carl. They soon began to call themselves brothers. Carl eventually reunited with his parents, who had divorced, and then remarried later in life.

The people Carl lived with told him to pick a religion he might want to join. Since many of his friends in school were Catholic, this was the religion he chose. From that point until the day he died, Carl was the most devoted Catholic on the

planet. Devoted Catholic, plus wonderful friend to all, plus a true gentleman.

Carl was voted Citizen of the Year in Manzanita in 2007. That's how wonderful he will always be. He was most appreciative of this honor, and (as I am sure, if you know Carl) didn't think he was worthy. Carl's trait of being a humble person followed him all his life. Women and men all around the country have words of praise for Carl. Also known as the Candy Man of the Manzanita Grocery & Deli, he never had a person leave the store without a smile on their face. He called all the women "girls" and they loved every minute of it. The children wanted to go to the store to see the "Candy Man," and they were always rewarded.

If you had Carl in your life it couldn't get any better. As a devoted Catholic, Carl showed feelings of humanity towards all those less fortunate, and was always giving to worthy causes, willing to give to those in need.

On Jan. 1, 2008, Carl married Patty Rinehart, and they enjoyed every minute of their time together. Patty made those trips with Carl from Manzanita to Vermont and back to Manzanita. Always eventful, and always fun in hindsight.

Carl loved his church, St. Mary's in Rockaway Beach, he loved his family, and he loved friends in Manzanita. He wanted to honor the hospice in Tillamook County for his special care, and his friends from church and Manzanita Grocery who made it possible for him to stay at home during his final days.

A service with military honors will be held at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland, Oregon, on Oct. 24, 2016, at 1:30 p.m. A memorial service will be held at St. Mary's Church in Rockaway Beach on Dec. 3 at 11 a.m.
