

Eight stabbed, hit by vehicle or otherwise hurt at Ohio State

COLUMBUS, Ohio — At least eight people were stabbed, hit by a vehicle or otherwise injured in an attack Monday on the Ohio State University campus, and a suspect was shot to death, school and hospital officials said.

Hospital officials said the eight victims had non-life-threatening injuries.

Police gave no immediate details on a possible motive for the attack.

The details started to emerge after a morning of

confusion and conflicting reports that began with the university issuing a series of tweets warning students that there was an “active shooter” on campus near the engineering building and that they should “run, hide, fight.” Numerous police vehicles and ambulances converged on the 60,000-student campus, and authorities blocked off roads.

The shelter-in-place warning was lifted about an hour and half later, and university spokesman Ben Johnson issued a statement that

made no mention of any gunfire other than the shooting of the suspect, who he said was killed. The injured were stabbed, hit by a vehicle or suffered other injuries, Johnson said.

A law enforcement official said the suspect is believed to have struck people with a car before beginning to stab victims. There was no indication that the suspect shot anyone, said the official, who was not authorized to publicly discuss the continuing investigation and spoke on condition of anonymity.

Two quakes recorded off Oregon Coast

BANDON — Two earthquakes have been recorded off Oregon’s central coast.

The U.S. Geological Survey said Monday the pair of earthquakes struck late Sun-

day and early Monday.

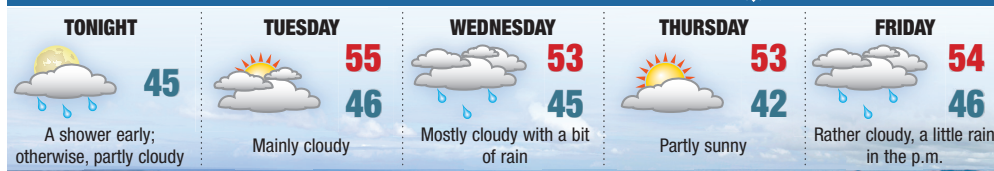
The first quake was a magnitude 4.9 and was recorded at 7:30 p.m. Pacific about 145 miles west of Coos Bay.

The USGS says it occurred at a depth of just over six miles.

The second temblor was a magnitude 4.8 and was recorded just after 2 a.m. Pacific on Monday.

The agency says it struck near the first one -- about 118 miles west of Coos Bay at a depth of less than 15 miles.

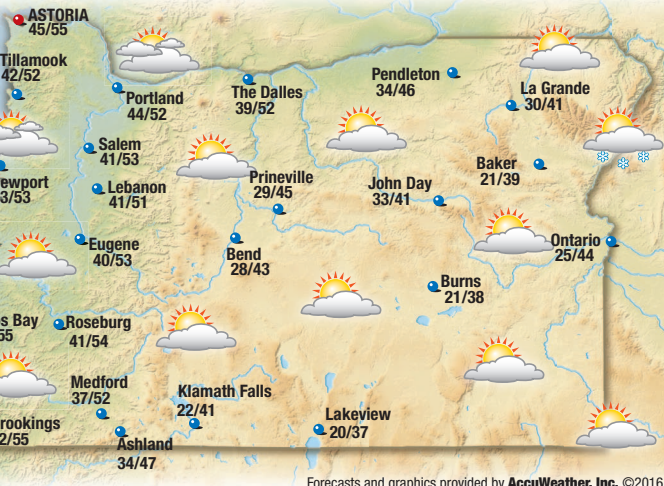

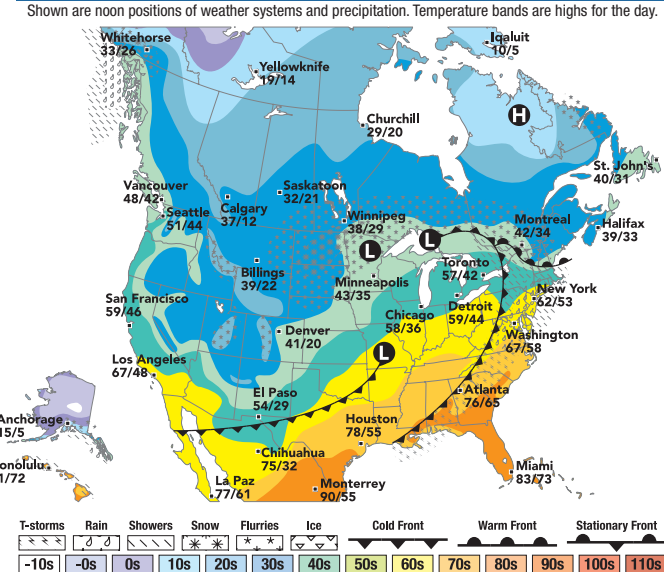

Boat sinks in Grays Harbor Friday

WESTPORT, Washington — The U.S. Coast Guard and Washington State Department of Ecology responded to a 41-foot vessel that sank at the Westport Marina Friday.

Watch standers at the Coast Guard’s 13th District command center in Seattle received notice early Friday from the emergency radio bea-

con aboard the fishing vessel Charlotte.

A crew from Station Grays Harbor investigated and found the vessel sunk in Grays Harbor, while watch standers contacted the vessel’s owner. Department of Ecology personnel deployed a boom around the vessel to contain and minimize the impact of possible pollutants.

Ballard Marine Construc-

tion was contracted using funds from the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund and started removing fuel from the vessel Saturday. The Coast Guard’s Incident Management Division is monitoring salvage and cleanup.

The vessel’s owner reported there was about 75 gallons of fuel on board. A light residual sheen was reported in the vicinity of the vessel.

Coast Guard evacuates injured crew member

The U.S. Coast Guard evacuated an injured crew member from a cargo vessel more than 170 miles offshore from the Columbia River Saturday.

The agent for the 618-foot log carrier Global Saikai, from Longview, Washing-

ton, requested assistance after a 23-year-old crew member reportedly fell from a ladder and broke his arm. An MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew from Air Station Astoria safely transported the man from the ship to the air station, where he was transferred to emergency responders and taken to Columbia Memorial Hospital.
