Astoria man hit by car near Safeway

An Astoria man is in a Portland area hospital after being hit by a car at an intersection near Safeway on Friday.

Rudy Gonzalez, 35, suffered various serious injuries including a broken leg and injuries to his face, according to the Astoria Police Department. He was taken by ambu-

lance to Columbia Memorial Hospital minutes after the accident occurred that evening. He was later taken to a Portland area hospital for additional treatment.

The driver who hit him, 74-year-old Madeline Jones, from Washington state, has no charges against her and is cooperating with the investigation. She told police she had the green light and didn't

see Gonzalez in the intersection. Witnesses told police Jones had the right of way and that Gonzalez appeared to wander into the intersection.

The accident occurred at 5:11 p.m. and shut down the eastbound lane on Lief Erikson Drive. Traffic had to be rerouted over to Franklin Avenue while emergency responders and police investigators were at the scene.

Tonight's Sky: Leading constellations of winter, including Orion and Canis Major, creep into view by mid-evening.



OSHA cites company in longshoreman's death

SEATTLE — Federal regulators say simple safety measures could have kept a dockworker from falling to his death aboard a cargo ship in Longview, Washington, last June.

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration on Tuesday cited the dockworker's employer, SSA Pacific, for what it described as willful safety violations aboard the Forest Trader.

The agency proposed a fine of just under \$125,000, and noted that it has cited SSA Pacific or its parent company, SSA Marine, for similar violations in Florida and Oregon in the past three years.

Longshoreman Jim Meadows died after falling 10 feet onto the ship's metal deck while

helping load timber at a Weyerhaeuser Co. dock. OSHA inspectors said the company failed to install netting or temporary platforms to protect workers from falls even after Meadows' death.

A spokeswoman for SSA Marine said the company did not have an immediate comment. The company has 15 days to contest the citation.
