Warriors rack up 83 points in win

WARRENTON — The Warrenton girls basketball team opened the season with a record-breaking win Friday night at home, 83-6 over Waldport.

Four players scored in double figures for the Warriors, led by Tyla Little with 18.

Rachel Dyer hit four 3-pointers on her way to 16 points, Landree Mieth scored 14 and Fernanda Alvarez added 11 for Warrenton, which tied the school record for the fifth-most points in a single game (83 vs. Oregon Episcopal in 2010).

The Warriors also limited an opponent to just six points for the first time (on record) since a 28-6 win over Westport in 1926-27, when the Warrenton girls were coached by "Mrs. Lee."

Warrenton's record for most points in a game is still 92, vs. Catlin Gabel in 2002. Waldport has now lost 63 games in a row, going back to the 2013-14 season.

Boomers edge Loggers, 47-44

KNAPPA — The Knappa Lady Loggers committed 41 turnovers and trailed by 14 points in the fourth quarter, but a late rally brought them to within three points of Toledo, before the Boomers were able to close out a 47-44 win over Knappa.

Toledo's Raeann Hogle scored 19 points in the first round game of the Loggers' Tip-Off Classic.

Kaitlyn Landwehr and Devin Vandergriff scored 12 points apiece and also had five steals each for the Loggers, while Paris Vanderburg had seven rebounds.

Lady Jays win again, 30-28

JEWELL — The Jewell Lady Jays are quickly rising to the top of 1A girls basketball, as the Lady Jays won for the third time in four days Saturday, 30-28 over Southwest Christian.

Jewell is the only 3-0 team at the Class 1A level, and the Jays have two more home games this week as they begin Casco League play.

In Saturday's win, Emma Guillen scored 11 points with seven rebounds, and teammate Heidi Hollenbach added eight points and pulled down 18 boards.

Southwest Christian led 2-1 after one quarter, before Jewell fought back to take a 9-8 halftime lead.

Guillen scores 17 in win

JEWELL — The Jewell girls opened the weekend with an easy 40-7 win over St. Stephens Academy Friday night, the first of four straight home games for the Lady Jays.

Jewell built a 34-0 halftime lead against the new school, competing in its first year of 1A basketball.

Emma Guillen led the Lady Jays with 17 points and 10 rebounds, followed by Lily Kaczanski with eight points and four steals. Ashley Wammack also had 10 rebounds, and Gabi Morales had four steals.

Kaech erupts for 21 in win

ILWACO, Wash. — Makenzie Kaech scored 21 points and Madeline Jacobson tossed in 20, helping the Ilwaco girls to an easy 67-28 win over Ocosta.

Eliza Bannister added 10 points for undefeated Ilwaco (3-0), which led 34-14 at halftime.

Balanced Blazers beat Bulls 112-110 for 3rd straight win

CHICAGO — Damian Lillard and the Portland Trail Blazers learned from last month's blowout loss to Chicago.

They turned that knowledge into their own road win Monday night.

Lillard had 30 points and seven assists, CJ McCollum scored 24 and the Trail Blazers beat the Bulls 112-110 for their third consecutive victory.

Portland had won five of six before Chicago visited the Moda Center on Nov. 15 and rolled to a 113-88 win. That loss started the Blazers on a bit of a slide, but they are rounding into form again.

"I think the game in Portland helped us prepare for what kind of game it was going to be," Lillard said. "We saw how physical they were. They compete on both ends of the floor. ... We just came in with the right mindset, knowing what to expect."

Allen Crabbe added 17 points for Portland, which opened a five-game trip with its fourth win in five games. Maurice Harkless had 11 and Evan Turner finished with 10, providing a nice boost in the fourth quarter.

"I'm really pleased the way we responded after the way they beat us the first time," Trail Blazers coach Terry Stotts said.

Dwyane Wade scored 34 points for the Bulls, and Jimmy Butler finished with 26 points, seven rebounds and five assists. Robin Lopez had seven points and a season-high 14 rebounds.

Chicago played without point guard Rajon Rondo, suspended one game for conduct detrimental to the team. There was no public indication from the Bulls on what triggered Rondo's suspension. He is expected to return Tuesday night in Detroit.

"He's obviously very important

with what we do in this building," coach Fred Hoiberg said. "He's a guy that really gets us out and establishes the tempo for our team, especially in the fourth quarter. He's important for what we do, but that's not the reason we lost the game."

Portland trailed 93-92 before Ed Davis converted a driving layup with 8:19 left, sparking an 11-0 run for the Trail Blazers. Turner made three straight jumpers and Lillard connected from long range to make it

103-93 with 5:55 left.

Chicago closed to 108-105 on Nikola Mirotic's two foul shots with 1:56 remaining, but Lillard made four free throws in the final seconds to help Portland hold on.

TILLAMOOK — Teams from District 1/4A officially opened the 2016-17 swim season Saturday, in the annual Tillamook Invitational.

The Tillamook girls and Newport boys won the team titles, as the Cubs racked up 455 points for their championship, well ahead of Taft (196), Scappoose (129) and Astoria (125).

The Seaside girls had four second-place event finishes, with two from sophomore Kendy Lin.

Lin swam the 100-yard freestyle in 1 minute, 1.11 seconds to place behind Tillamook's Kara Putman;

and she also took second in the 100-yard backstroke (1:10.53).

Lin added points for the Gulls by swimming a leg on the 400-yard freestyle relay, as the foursome of Lin, sophomore Kimberly Mella, senior Cadyn Carr and sophomore Maya McGill finished a close second in 4:23.29, behind Newport's 4:23.13.

McGill also finished second in the 200-yard freestyle and third in the 500-yard freestyle.

The Astoria girls had two fourth-place showings (Megan Schacher in the 100-yard butterfly and Kendall Gustafson in the 100-yard breaststroke); while Shannon Christie took

fifth out of 56 entrants in the 50-yard freestyle.

On the boys' side, Seaside's Will Garvin finished third in both the butterfly and 100-yard backstroke.

Astoria hosts the annual Andrew Nygaard Invitational Saturday.
