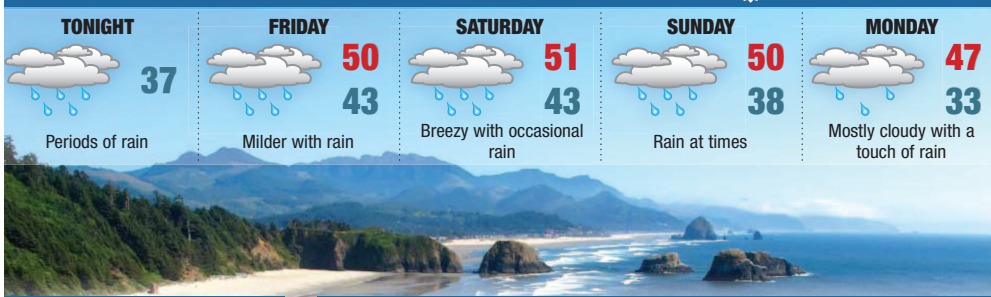

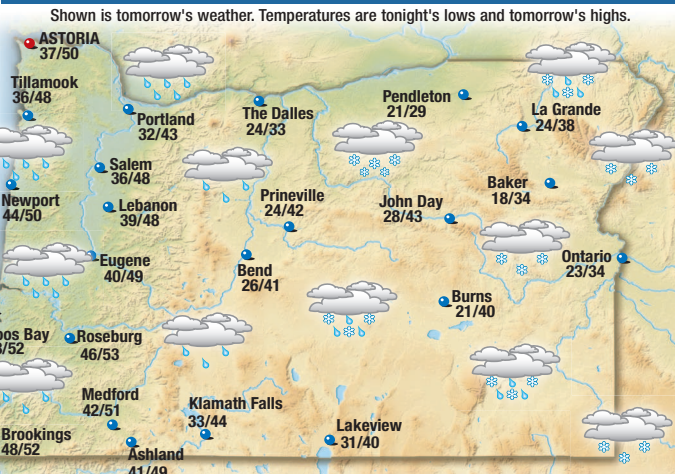

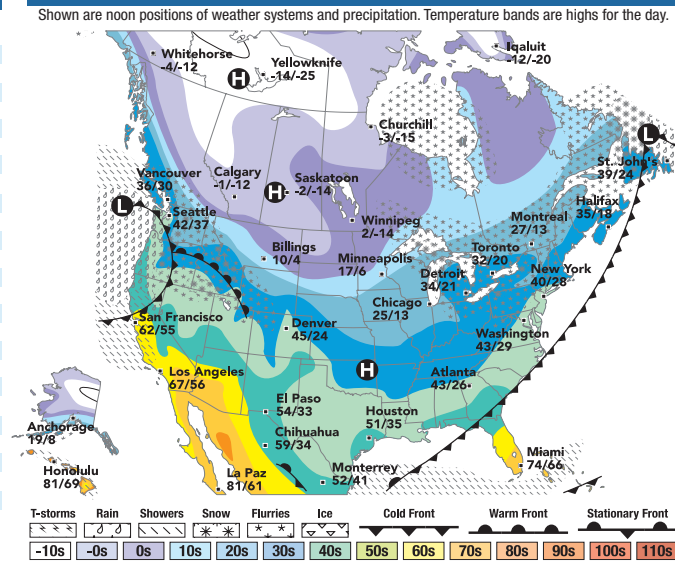

Northern California quake measured at 6.5 magnitude

SAN FRANCISCO — A 6.5 magnitude earthquake struck off the coast of Northern California on Thursday,

jolting residents of the coastal town of Ferndale but bringing no immediate reports of damage or injuries.

The quake hit at 6:50 a.m. in the Pacific Ocean about 100

miles west of Ferndale, the U.S. Geological Survey said.

The Pacific Tsunami Warning Center said in a statement there was no threat of a tsunami.

Officials launch database for lead tests

PORTLAND — State officials have launched an online database that allows parents to find out how much lead is in the water in their chil-

dren's school. The Oregon Health Authority said Wednesday that the tool provides an interactive map and displays results for individual school buildings across the state.

The state does not have statutory authority to mandate testing for lead in school drinking water, but state officials have strongly recommended all schools test their facilities.
