Carole Lee Bingham, 80, passed away Jan. 5, 2017, at the Clatsop Care Memory Community in Warrenton, Oregon.

She was born April 6, 1936, in Independence, Oregon, to parents Archie and Dorothy Hutchens. Dorothy was later remarried to Victor Colvin.

Carole was an only child. Throughout her early life she lived in Silverton, Scappoose and Olney. She graduated from Astoria High School in 1954.

On Aug. 18, 1954, she married Jim Bingham in Astoria. They remained in the Astoria area their entire married life.

Carole worked at Safeway and Three Boys Market as a checker. She then worked at Clatsop County as an elections deputy until her retirement.

She was active in church as organist at Lewis & Clark Bible Church, and then at the Olney Community Church as pianist. She was very creative and talented in many areas. Her hobbies included needlepoint, quilting and painting. She was very fond of classical music and the works of William Shakespeare.

Carole was loved, and will be greatly missed by her surviving family: her husband, Jim Bingham; son Richard Bingham and wife, Kristen, of Wisconsin; son Robert (Bob) Bingham and wife, Debbie, of Astoria; daughter Connie Rinell and husband, Kim, of Astoria; and son Roger Bingham and wife, Mary Ann, of Aloha, Oregon; as well as 11 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

### Lyman Gerald Hawken

Cannon Beach

Nov. 3, 1924 — Dec. 4, 2016



Lyman Gerald Hawken was born in Portland, Oregon, to Gladys and Lyman Hawken Sr. He was raised in Vernonia, graduating with the Class of 1942.

After high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served honorably during World War II in the Pacific Theater. Upon returning from the war, Lyman married Betty Marl in 1945. They settled in Vernonia and had a son, Richard. While living in Vernonia, along with his father, Lyman Sr., they owned and operated the Standard Oil Co. and a car dealership, Hawken Motors. In 1957 the family moved to St. Helens, where they opened another Hawken Motors.

Betty preceded Lyman in death in 1975.

In the late 1970s, Lyman moved to the family beach house, built by his grandfather in Cannon Beach. In 1978, Lyman married Ruth Knutson of St. Helens. They owned and operated the Cannon Beach Seafood Market in the 1980s, where they made the very best smoked salmon and clam chowder! After retirement, they had a second home in Plains, Montana.

Lyman loved the ocean, particularly dory fishing out of Cannon Beach. In the 1970s and 1980s, he and Richard could be found fishing together on their boats The Bostonian and The Seahawk. He really loved the time they shared on the water. He also enjoyed his gun collection. He loved reloading his ammo upstairs in his shop, where he also made custom leather holsters, visors, wallets and many other things.

Lyman was an avid painter. It was not uncommon to receive a hand painted card from him.

Lyman was a 71-year member of the American Legion. He served numerous times as post commander in Cannon Beach. He was always willing to volunteer, and welcomed people with his friendly face. His favorite events were the crab and oyster feeds. When Lyman could no longer drive, he would "drive" his wheelchair down to the legion hall.

Lyman's last months were spent surrounded by loved ones. He is survived by his wife, Ruth Hawken of Astoria; son, Richard Hawken of Seaside; stepdaughter Tara Culver

of Astoria (husband Harold); granddaughters Monique Gangle of Troutdale (husband Richie, great-grandchildren Hailie and Madisyn), and Michelle Wunderlich of Seaside (husband Tim, great-grandchildren Annika, Riley and Madden).

Lyman was preceded in death by stepchildren Eric (Jenny) and Dirk Knutson, step-grandson Jarad Knutson, and is survived by step-grandchildren and great-grandchildren Kristina Chalk (Jeremy, Rhiannon and William), and Jesse Younger.

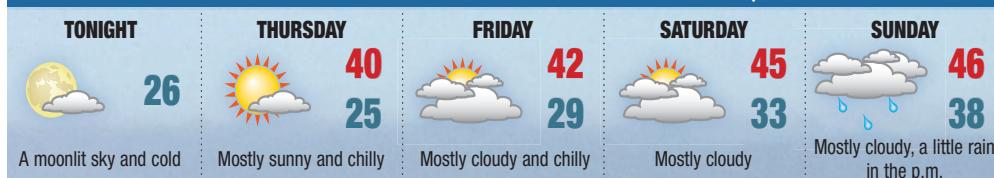

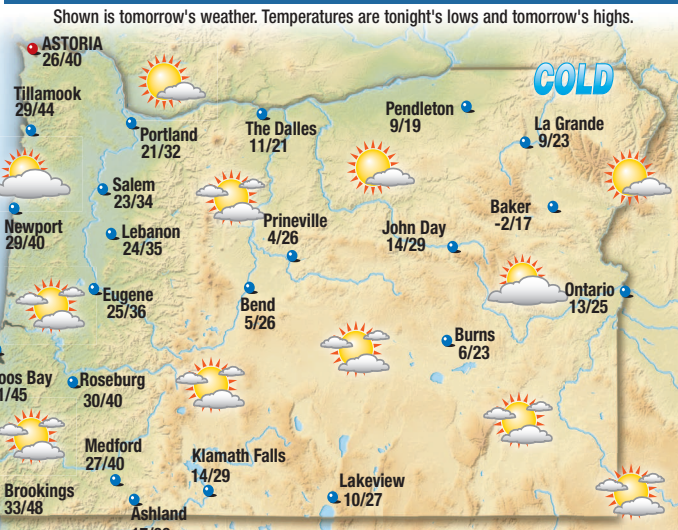

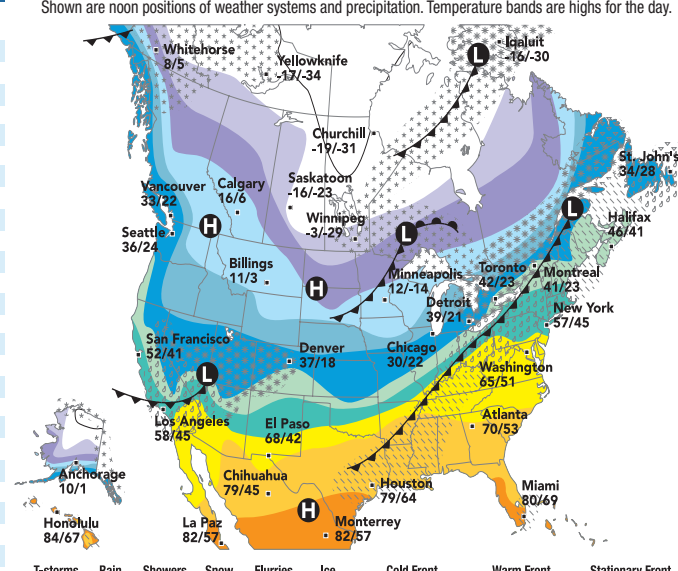

## Jones-Centeno hired as Liberty's artistic director

Bereniece Jones-Centeno, the former interim managing director of the Astoria Music Festival, has been named the Liberty Theater's new artistic director.

Jones-Centeno, who was hired after the theater conducted a two-month search, will handle programming for the Liberty while developing educational programs for area youth at the venue.

"As an advocate for access to arts and culture," Jones-Centeno said in a release, "I consider the Liberty Theater to be one of Astoria's seats of opportunity for those seeking great entertainment. Growth in Astoria is being mirrored by the diversity in programming at the Liberty Theater."

She added that theater director Jennifer Crockett and the board of directors are "on a mission to help Astorians and other culture locavores engage in programs that speak to them. It's thrilling to have been asked to lead this charge."

A member of the Oregon Cultural Trust Board of Directors, Jones-Centeno holds graduate degrees in music and arts administration and is completing her doctorate in musicology at the University of Oregon.

"We are very fortunate to have Bereniece Jones-Centeno in our city and as our new artistic director," Crockett said.
