## Warrenton students offer grants

WARRENTON — Warrenton High School is participating in the Harold and Arlene Schnitzer CARE Foundation's "CommuniCare" program, designed to introduce young people to the importance of community service and the role of nonprofit organizations in their local communities. WHS has raised and donated \$33,000 over the past three years, and is awarding additional grants in 2017.

This year, the student body identified health and human

services as well as education as important issues to support, and grants totaling \$11,000 are being made to nonprofit organizations that address these same areas of concern.

Warrenton students are now assessing applications for those grants. Organizations that wish to apply for funding should include the following information: How the organization helps with health and human services or education in Clatsop County; the organization's mission, programs and objectives and population served; the nature and the amount of the request;

and a brief description of what would be done with the money. A copy of an IRS determination letter verifying the tax-exempt status of the organization is also needed.

The deadline to apply is March 3. Email proposals to westj@warrentonk12.org, or mail them to CommuniCare, in care of Warrenton High School, 1700 S.E. Main Ave., Warrenton, OR 97146. A decision on the grant awards will be made no later than April 28, and notification will be made shortly thereafter.
