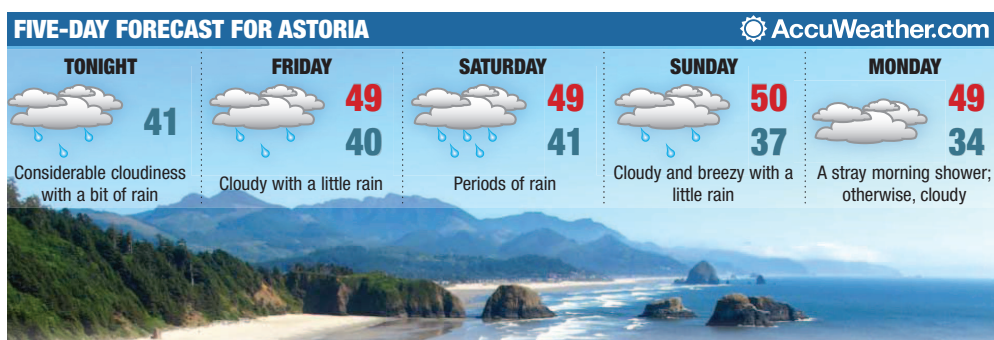
Jazz guitar concert rescheduled

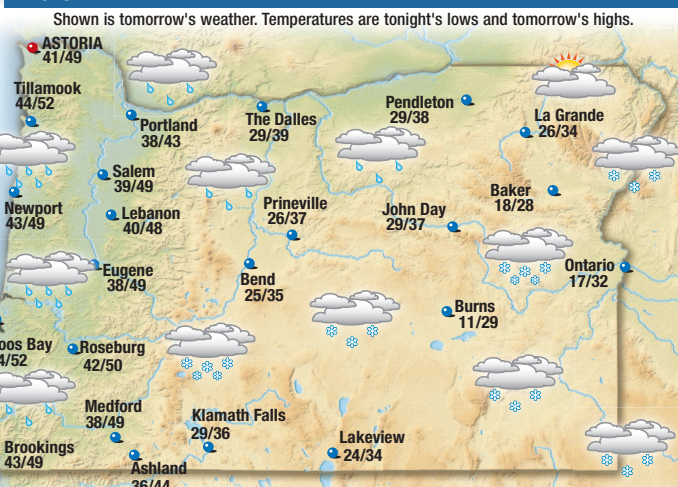

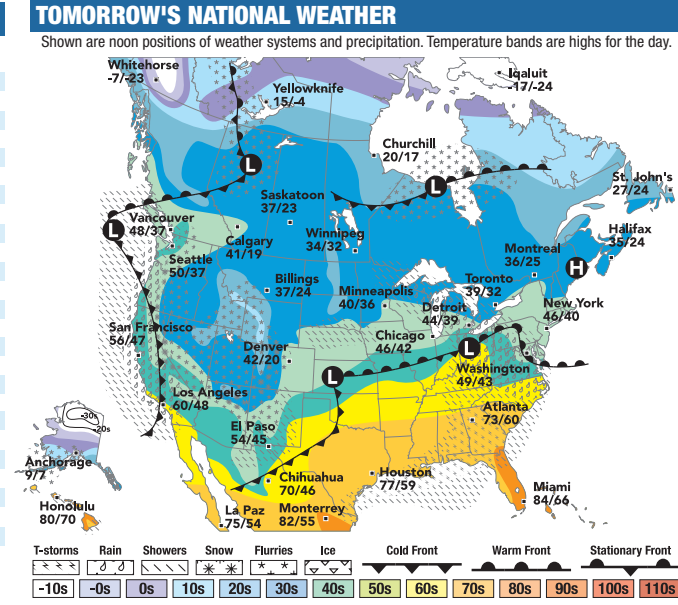
