College hosts free course on emergency shelters

SEASIDE — Clatsop Community College will host a free course to help prepare people for running an emergency shelter after a disaster.

"Comprehensive Shelter Training," a five-session course taught by Red Cross-certified instructors, trains and certifies participants in basic food safety, psychological first aid, serving people with functional and access needs and reconnecting people through the Red Cross' Safe & Well online system. Allison Coffinberger will share her experience running warming centers, and will discuss the differences between shelters and warming centers.

The core section, "Shelter Fundamentals," includes procedures for setting up, running and closing a shelter during a disaster. A case study and a final simulation complete the course.

The entire course is free. Classes meet at the college's South County Campus at 1455 N. Roosevelt Drive in Seaside, adjacent to Diamond Heating.

The first two classes will be from 6 to 9 p.m. Jan. 27 and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Jan. 28. The final three classes will be held at the same times Feb. 3 and 4, with the final simulation from 1 to 5 p.m. Feb. 5.
