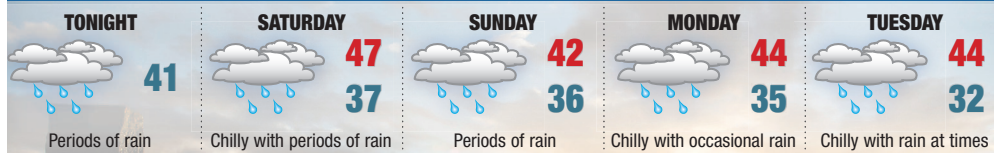

The third-annual Clatsop County Career and Job Fair, which brings together employers and high schoolers Feb. 22, is expanding to include adults.

Organizer Kevin Leahy said he expects 75 employers and 800 attendees at the free event, which runs from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Clatsop County Fairgrounds. The focus of the fair will be 60 per-

cent on careers and 40 percent on jobs.

Astoria, Jewell, Knappa, Seaside and Warrenton high schools will send juniors and seniors in the morning. At 2 p.m., the doors reopen for adults seeking more information about local job and career opportunities.

The event will focus on filling summer positions in the county for college-bound students. In addition, the event

will help employers in the vocational trades find skilled employees and job apprenticeships and job-shadowing opportunities.

Industries represented at the fair include tourism, hospitality, professional services, seafood-processing, fishing, forest products, health care, retail, manufacturing, law enforcement, career-technical trades, education, government and the military.
