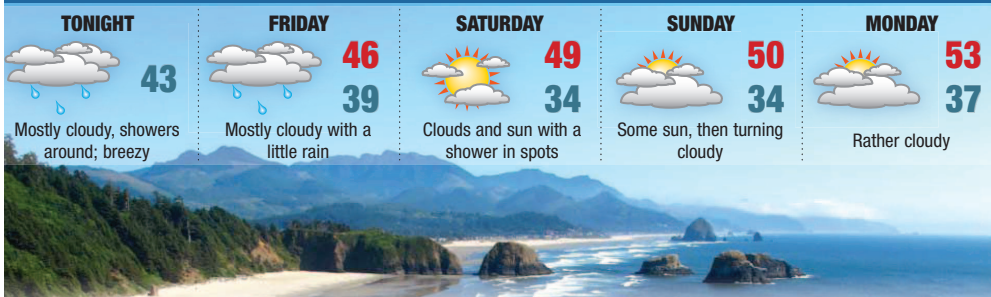

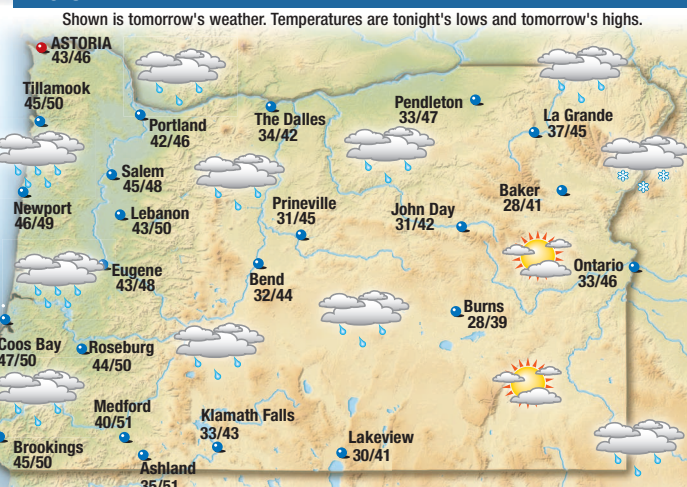

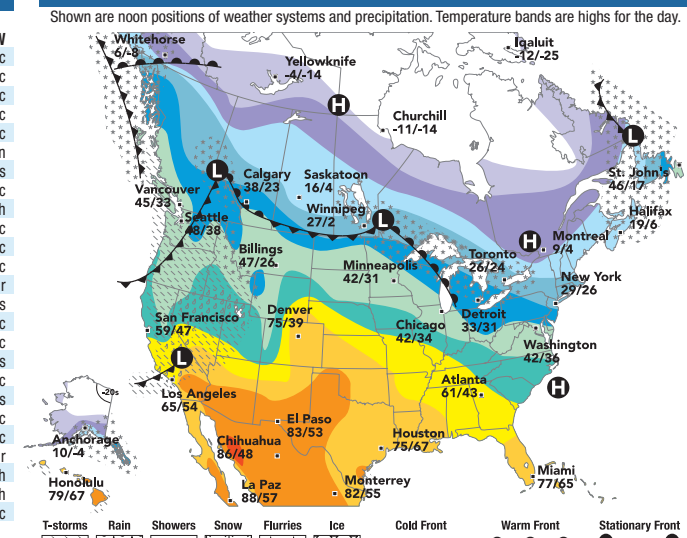

Police search for missing Hammond man

A Hammond man has been missing since early Wednesday morning after leaving a hotel in Portland.

Ronald Austin, 75, reportedly left the Silver Cloud Inn at roughly 5 a.m. Wednesday to pick his wife up at Good Samaritan Hospital. Austin never arrived, though, and

hasn't been located or heard from since.

The Warrenton Police Department has been notified of his disappearance and has searched his home and the surrounding area, Police Chief Mathew Workman said.

"Usually in cases like this you have someone with dementia or some sort of

mental issue," Workman said. "But they said he didn't have anything, so it was kind of strange."

Police describe Austin as a white man, 5 feet 6 inches tall and 160 pounds. He may be driving a 2006 Toyota Tacoma with a canopy.
