

Deputies seek help locating a Vernonia shooting suspect

Columbia County Sheriff's deputies and other area officers are looking into a shooting in the Vernonia area Saturday.

They are asking for the public's help in locating Gregory Reynolds, 37, who is suspected of shooting a man just south of Vernonia.

Lewis Cochran, 45, of Vernonia was reportedly shot and sent to Oregon Health and Science University Hospital. Reynolds, of Vernonia, reportedly fired multiple shots from his pickup truck in the 58000 block of Kirk Road about 2:50 p.m.

Deputies located the suspect's two-toned, red and white Ford pickup at Reynolds' last known residence at 3:17 p.m. and surrounded the house at 58442 S. Nehalem Highway. The Washington

County tactical team assisted officers at the scene, and the highway was shut down at 7:30 p.m. to search for the suspect in the house and the surrounding area.

Reynolds is a white male, 6 feet 1 inches tall and 150 pounds, with brown hair and beard and hazel eyes. He was last seen wearing dirty blue jeans and a dark-colored jacket. Reynolds is wanted on several felony warrants not associated with this incident and is sought for questioning. He should be considered armed and dangerous. Collision blocked Highway 30

A collision between a dump truck and a passenger car blocked eastbound lanes of U.S. Highway 30 near Bradley Hill on Friday afternoon.

The dump truck, driven by Nicholas Culbertson, 31, of Clatskanie, and a red 1998 Ford Escort, driven by Andrea Keebler, 48, of Brush Prairie, Washington, were both traveling

westbound. The truck began to turn left when it was struck on the driver's side shortly before 1 p.m., Oregon State Police said. Medical personnel responded to the scene to assist drivers with possible injuries.

Eastbound lanes were temporarily blocked as flaggers kept traffic moving in both directions. Vehicles eventually were removed and all lanes were reopened.

Coast Guard rescues ejected river kayaker

HAMMOND — The U.S. Coast Guard rescued a kayaker who fell out while paddling towards the Columbia River near Hammond Sunday.

Watchstanders at Sector Columbia River in Warrenton received a report via 911 dispatch of a male kayaker who had struck pilings in the river and been ejected from his kayak. The watchstanders directed the launch of an MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew from Air Station Astoria and two small rescue

boats from Station Cape Disappointment.

The boats could not reach the kayaker through the pilings, but the helicopter crew lifted the man from the pilings and ferried him to shore, where he was met by local emergency medical services and released on site. A Clatsop County Sheriff's Office ground team assisted with the rescue and guided the helicopter to the location of the kayaker.

"With spring around the corner, it is important to remind boaters of safety while

in the waters along the Oregon and Washington coast," said Mark Dobney, a search and rescue controller at Sector Columbia River. "The water temperatures in this area hover around 50 degrees year-round, and while this man was wearing a proper flotation device, he was not properly dressed for the water. Had it not been our rescue services quick response time, the situation for this kayaker would have quickly become dire."

Weather on scene included 10-mph winds, 2-foot seas and heavy rain.

States mark anniversary of Japanese internment

SALEM — States are marking the 75th anniversary of the signing of Executive Order 9066 by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt that forced 120,000 Japanese immigrants and Japanese-Americans into internment camps.

Most were from Oregon, California and Washington state. Adults, including the elderly, and children could only bring what they could carry and were transported by bus and train, often with blacked-out windows. They were sent, ostensibly to avoid sabotage and spying, to

camps in California, Idaho, Wyoming, Colorado, Arizona and other states as far away as Arkansas.

Oregon, California and Washington are not only marking Sunday's anniversary, but politicians and activists say America must learn from this dark chapter of history.
