

Man arrested in Vernonia shooting

A man has been arrested in connection to a drive-by shooting in the Vernonia area on Feb. 18.

The Columbia County Sheriff's Office announced it had taken Gregory Reynolds, 37, of Vernonia, into custody as the suspect in the shooting. Deputies located Reynolds' car in the driveway of his


family home following the shooting but were unable to find him.

With a court order, deputies found Reynolds hiding underneath the house Wednesday morning.
