ASD recognizes Hampton Affiliates

The Astoria School District Board recognized Hampton Affiliates, Lois Perdue, plant manager at the Warren-ton site, and Cliff Tuttle of Special Projects at their March 9 meeting.

The school district has partnered with Hampton Affiliates to obtain a Career and Technical Education grant for over \$280,000 through the Oregon Department of Education that provides

Astoria High School students with technology and engineering skills.

In addition, with Tuttle and Perdue's leadership, Hampton Affiliates has created a summer internship for four to six AHS students to provide them with valuable job-seeking skills, work experience and the opportunity to learn technical skills needs at a lumber mill site.
