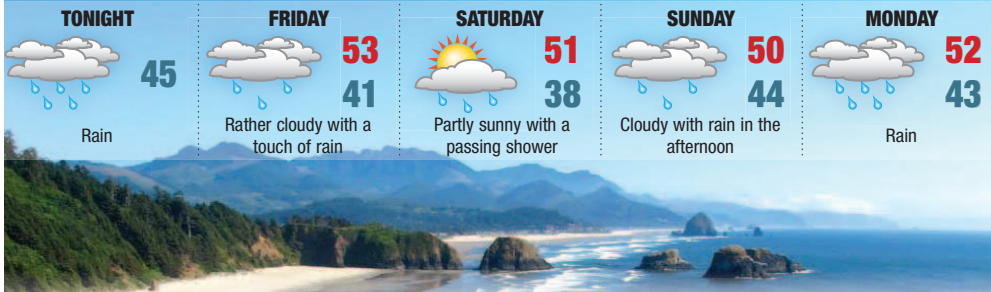

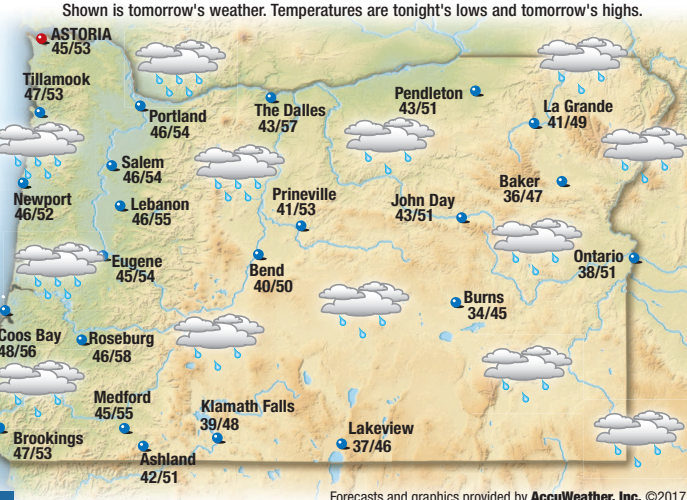

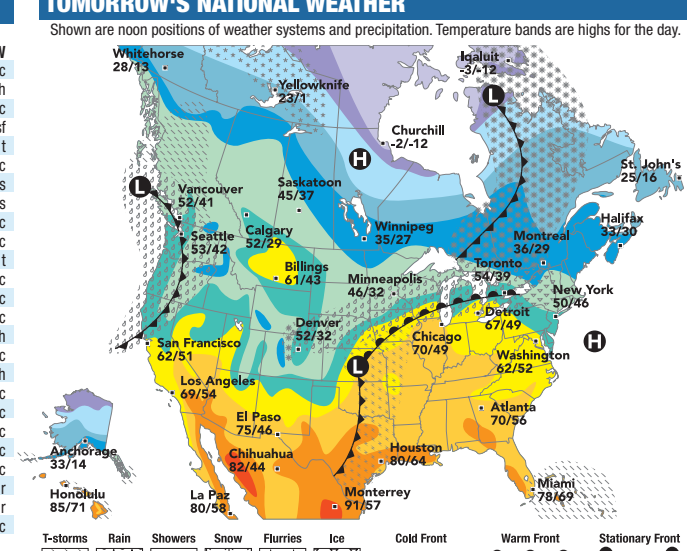

She is survived by her adoring husband, Kevin Riddle. In their love they shared a deep, rich existence that included travel, home life, entertaining and a concern for nature and this planet we all share. She also wanted to make it clear to all — she never shopped at Walmart.
