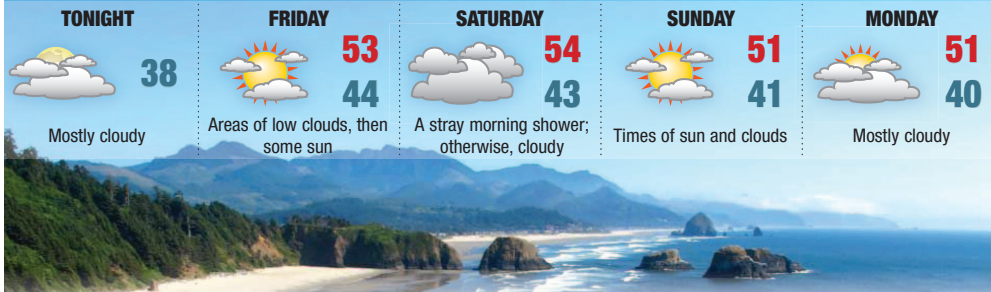

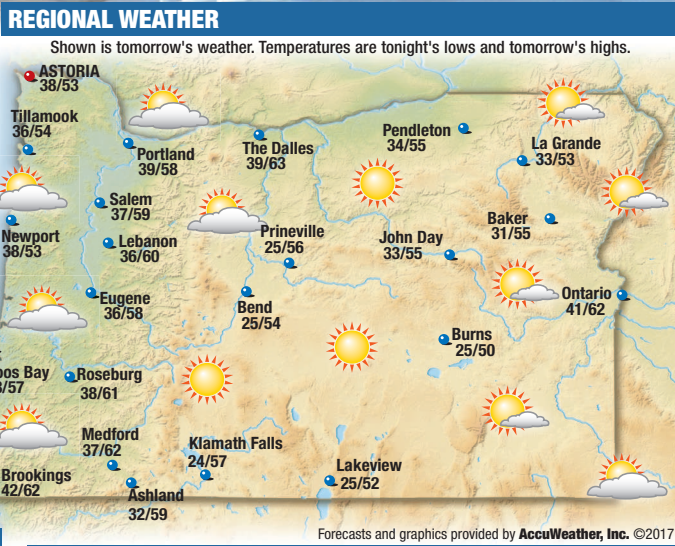

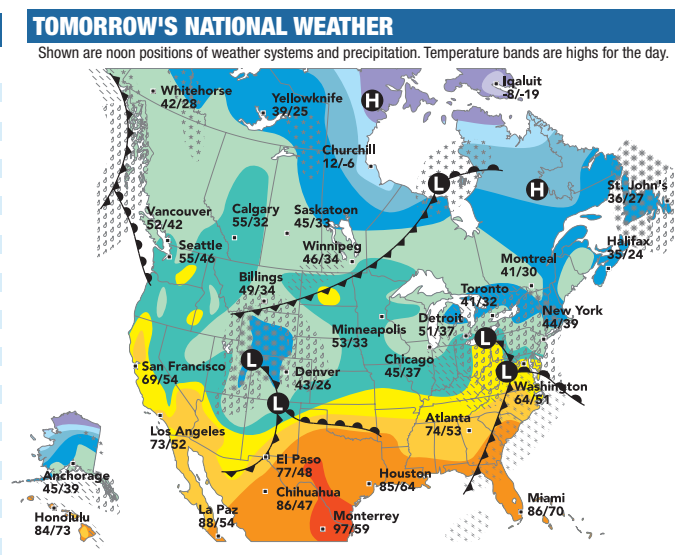

Boat dumped oily bilge water

A fishing company with a vessel based at the Warrenton Marina has been fined for dumping oily bilge water into

the Skipanon River.

Freedom Fisheries, a company based out of Mosier, was fined \$10,800 by the state Department of Environmental Quality for

the incident that occurred in January. Crew members of the Anne Marie dumped about a gallon of the oily water into the river, according to the state.

Free park days in Washington state

Visitors will be able to enter state parks in Washington state without daytime passes twice this April. Free daytime use of the park will be allowed April 15 and April 22 — Earth Day.

The passes, required for vehicle access, cost

\$30 for annual admission and \$10 daily. Parks are open for free daytime use six more times after April this year. Passes will still be required for those days on state Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Natural Resources lands. Washington has more than 100 state parks that cover over 120,000 acres.
