

Coast Guard rescues man stranded at Hug Point

The U.S. Coast Guard rescued a man stranded on a rocky edge by the high tide at Hug Point near Cannon Beach Monday.

Watchstanders at Sector Columbia River in Warrenton were notified of the stranded man by Oregon State Police at 1:33 p.m. An MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter rescue crew was launched

and arrived on scene at 2:16 p.m. The crew lowered an aviation survival technician down to hoist the man off the rocky edge and away from the incoming surf.

The man was flown to Air Station Astoria in Warrenton, where he was treated and released by paramedics.

"We arrived just in time as the man was clinging to a rope and was being splashed by incoming waves," Lt. j.g.

Jason Weeks, the pilot of the helicopter, said in a statement. "We remind all beachgoers that enjoy the tide pools and cliff sides along the Oregon coastline to always be mindful of changing tide because it may appear safe one minute but can trap you the next."

Weather and sea conditions on scene were 25 mph winds with moderate rain showers and 18-foot seas.

Authorities seek to identify body

The body of a man located on a Brookfield, Washington, beach April 2 has yet to be identified, and the cause of death is still unknown.

After recreational boaters found the body, tests attempting to determine a cause of death were inconclu-

sive. Autopsies likely will not determine the cause of death due to the condition of the remains, Wahkiakum County Prosecuting Attorney Dan Bigelow said.

But officials are looking at some promising leads that may help identify the body, Bigelow said.

The man was roughly

6 feet tall, 160 pounds and wearing jeans and a T-shirt. Bigelow said the body likely came from upstream on the Columbia River but west of the John Day Dam. Bigelow, who also serves as the county coroner, estimated the man had been dead for a number of months, but within the last year.

Clatsop County gets new sheriff's deputy

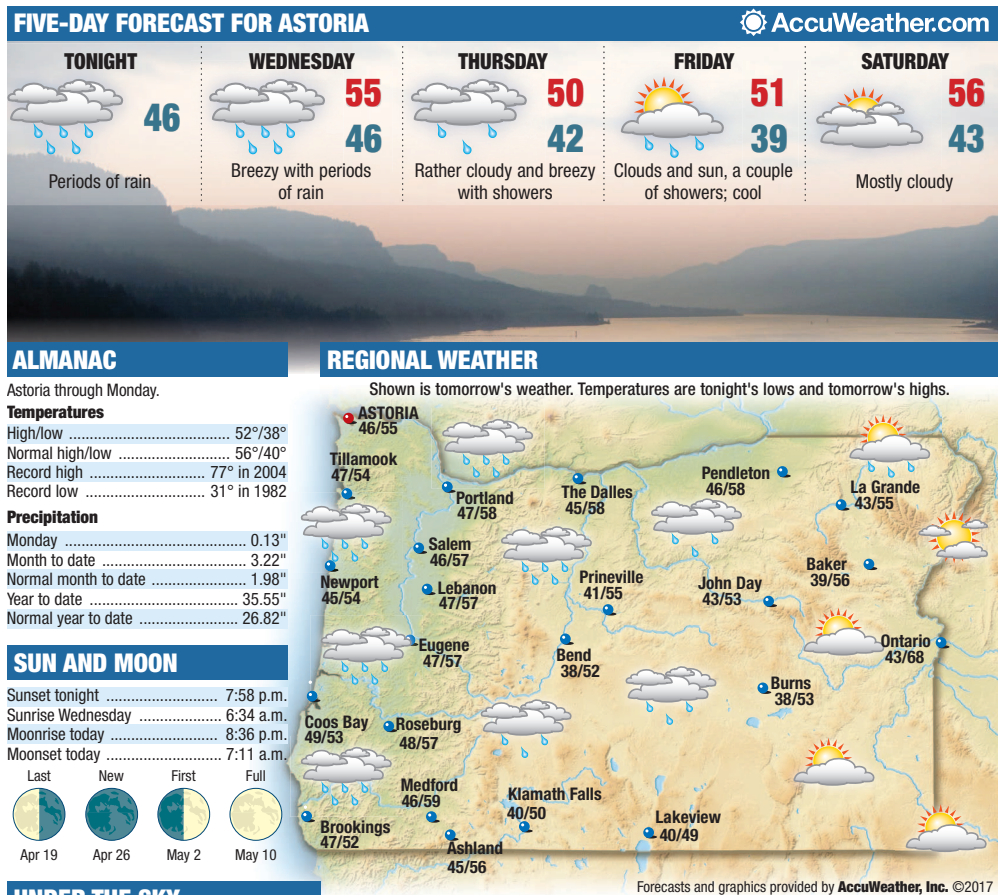
