Ecola State Park closed again

New damage to the recently repaired entrance road outside Ecola State Park will close the park again for an additional two weeks.

The park was closed for about a week until April 20 due to damage on the same road. But additional landslides created another hole in the road

Landslides on the hill have been more active lately, meaning periodic closure will occur more often, Park Manager Ben Cox said. The road has developed issues in places that historically were fine.

In the most recent closure, contractors removed damaged asphalt sections and replaced them with compacted gravel.

"We simply do not know where the next problem will occur," Cox said.

Mobile Produce Pantry starts next week

Free fruits and vegetables are again being distributed by the Clatsop Community Action Regional Food Bank's Mobile Produce Pantry to qualifying low-income residents in Clatsop County beginning Thursday and continuing every Thursday through Sept. 28 at four locations.

This summer marks the fifth year of the program, a Food Bank Fresh initiative, launched by the food bank in 2012 The times and locations

are as follows: Astoria, 9 to 10:30 a.m., 200 block of Marine Drive, between Second and Third streets; Seaside, 12 to 1:30 p.m., Seaside Factory Outlet Mall, 1111 N. Roosevelt Drive; Cannon Beach, 3 to 4:30 p.m., 268 Beaver St.; and Warrenton, 3 to 4:30 p.m., 2010 SE Chokeberry Ave.

The free fruits and vegetables are in addition to the

food people receive during their regular visit to a food pantry. Much of the fresh produce received at the CCA Regional Food Bank comes directly from the efforts of the Oregon Food Bank and the Network of Regional Food Banks.

Volunteers are needed, specifically during shifts at Mobile Produce Pantry locations, or preparing the products prior to the pantries. For information, call 503-861-3663.

New bill keeps medical, recreational pot separate

SALEM — Lawmakers are considering a proposal to keep medical marijuana regulation under the Oregon Health Authority through a new cannabis commission.

Legislators on the Joint Committee on Marijuana Regulation took

mony Tuesday evening on a recently amended version of a bill that initially proposed to merge the state's medical and recreational marijuana programs under the Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

Under the amended bill, the cannabis commission, under the umbrella of the health authority, would instead enter into an agreement with the liquor commission to track medical marijuana produced on grow sites with 12 or more plants.

A medical marijuana grower would be able to sell up to 25 pounds per year to an OLCC-licensed marijuana wholesaler — an effort to prevent medical marijuana surpluses from being sold illegally.
