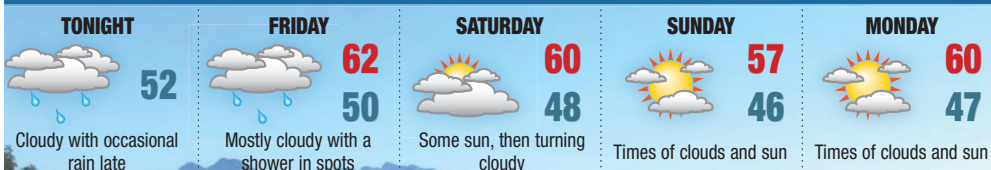

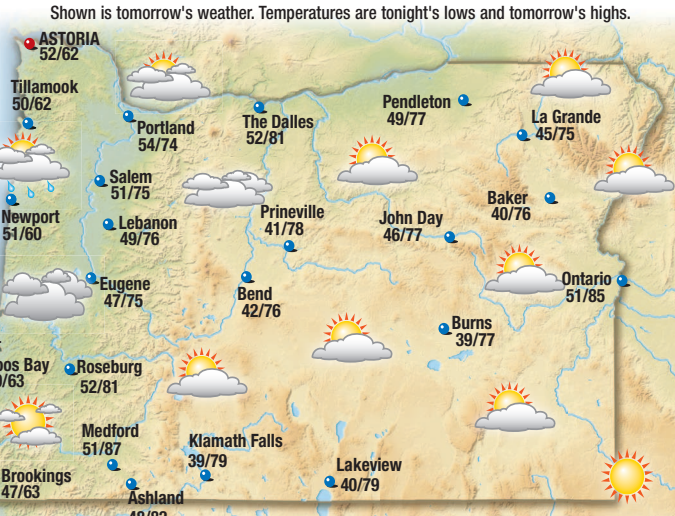

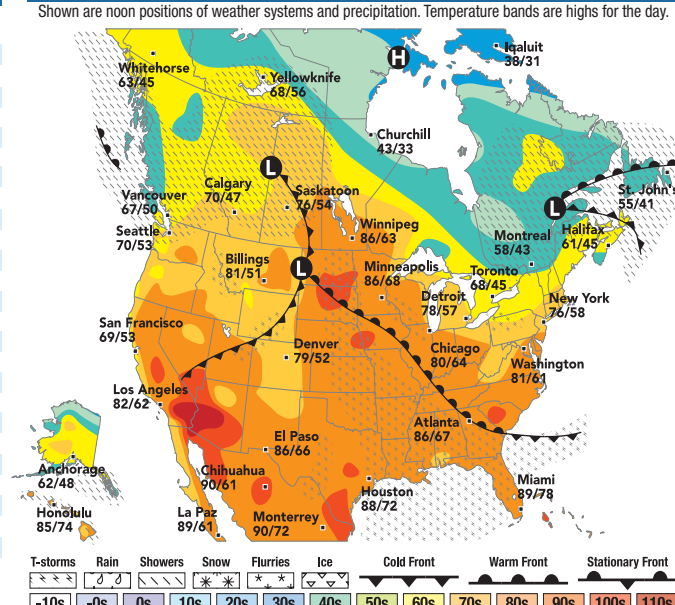

## States set Columbia River sturgeon seasons

Recreational white sturgeon seasons for the Columbia River estuary have been set by fishery managers from Oregon and Washington state.

Sturgeon retention is allowed three days a week, from Monday through June

17 from the Wauna power lines downstream approximately 40 miles to Buoy 10. Retention days are Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays until 2 p.m., including catch and release.

The daily bag limit is one fish, and the size restriction is 44 to 50 inches fork length.

The open area includes Youngs Bay, all adjacent Washington state tributaries, and the main stem.

The annual bag limit for white sturgeon is two fish; any sturgeon previously tagged in 2017 count against this limit. For information, go to <http://bit.ly/2rY4UDG>
