Middle school students get chance to do science, tech

Local middle-schoolers get a free opportunity to try their hands at making solar cars and earthquake simulations in July through Oregon State University.

The two-day Cosey Mobile Science and Engineering Camp will visit Astoria Middle School July 10 and 11 and is open to Astoria- and Warrenton-area students entering the sixth through ninth grade. A subsequent two-day camp will visit Seaside Heights Elementary School July 12 and 13 for students in Seaside, Gearhart and Cannon Beach.

The STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) camps, which run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, will provide lunch

and the opportunity for students to design solar-powered cars, create earthquake simulations and more.

Registration ends one week prior to the camp. Register for the Astoria camp at http://tinyurl.com/COSEY-Astoria, and for the Seaside camp at http://tinyurl.com/COSEY-Seaside. If all slots fill up, registrants can be placed on a waiting list.

Students must have a parent or guardian sign waivers during registration in order to participate in the camp. Families can pick up forms for the camps, in both English and Spanish, at their local school.
