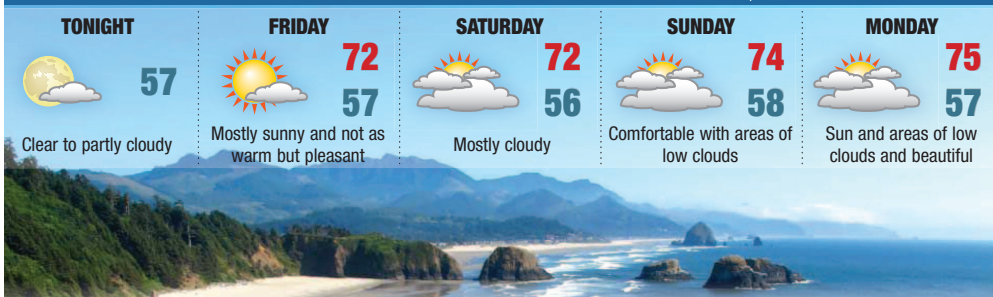

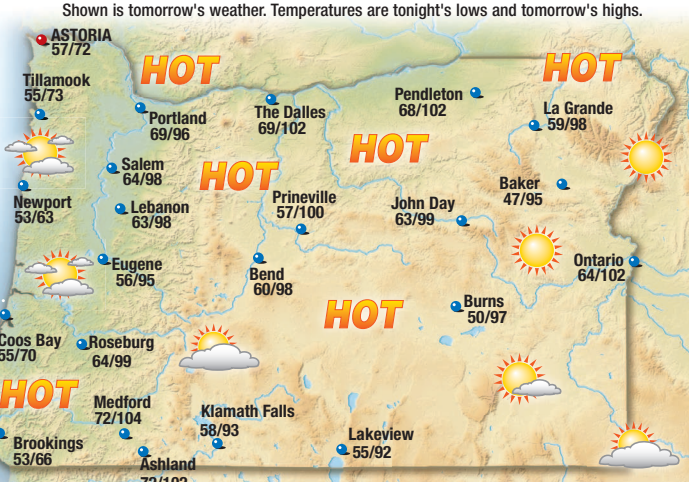

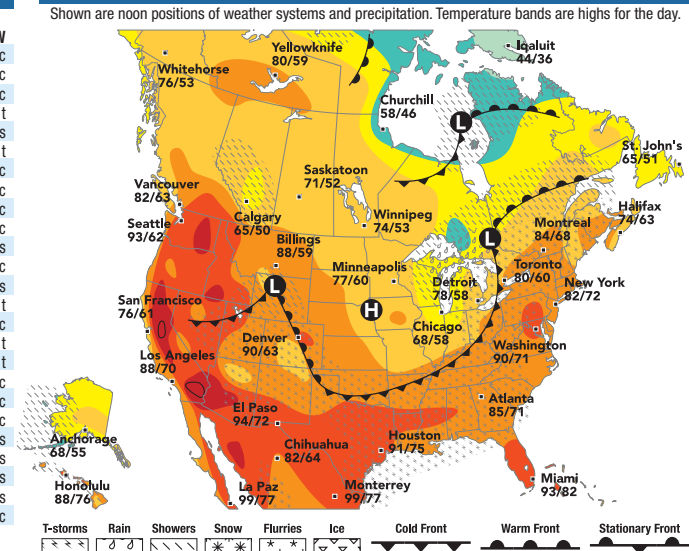

# Judge reverses decision on suit against Oregon over forestlands

ALBANY — A judge has withdrawn an earlier opinion that appeared to jeopardize a lawsuit filed by Linn County and other governmental units over the management of state forest trust lands.

The Albany Demo-

crat-Herald reports that Linn County Circuit Court Daniel Murphy ruled in June that Linn County and the 140 other counties and taxing districts included in the class-action lawsuit could not sue the state for monetary damages. That potentially threw a wrench in the lawsuit against the Oregon Department of Forestry.

The lawsuit seeks \$1.4 billion from the state for failing to maximize logging revenues on forest trust lands.

The judge agreed to withdraw his decision after a July 13 meeting with attorneys for the state and Linn County.

# Man rescued from water Wednesday night

Emergency personnel pulled a man from the Columbia River Wednesday evening after he was spotted about 150 yards downriver from the Cannery Pier Hotel.

Astoria Fire Department, Astoria Police Department, the Port of Astoria and Oregon State Police and Medix arrived at the Port at about 9 p.m. The man was treated at a Port fuel dock and taken to Columbia Memorial Hospital for evaluation.

Port Executive Director Jim Knight said Maintenance Foreman Tim Pietsch heard about a man in the water from security guard Matt Hansen and took a patrol boat to the scene just as the man was start-

ing to go underwater. Knight said Pietsch then held onto the man until the police could arrive.
