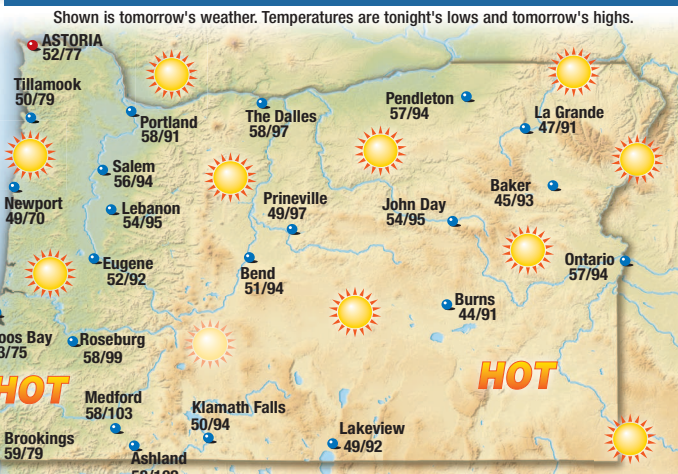

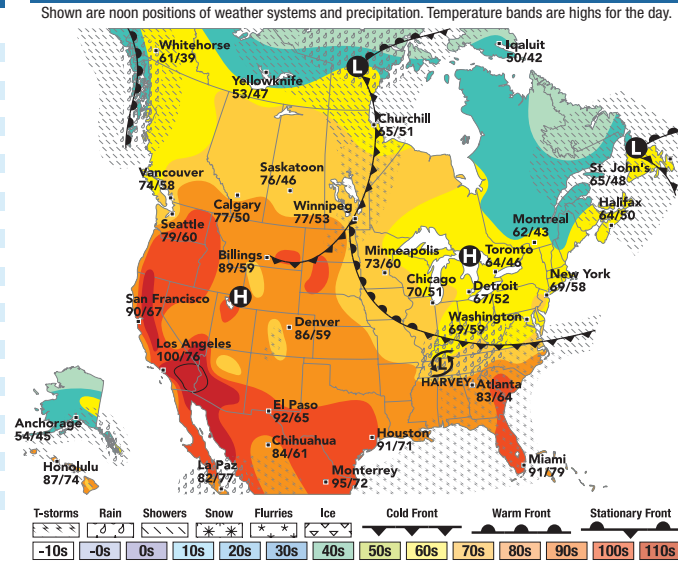

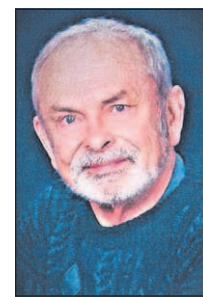

Gary began his lifelong meat-cutting career at Safeway in Tillamook, then moved to Seaside where he purchased the Ocean Vista Meat Market and set meat cases in small grocery stores throughout town. He was a devoted follower of Jesus Christ and an active member of the Cannon Beach Community Church, where a celebration of life service is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 2, 2017, at 11 a.m., with lunch to follow.
