Man charged with attempted murder in shooting

EUGENE — The man arrested in the shooting of an Oregon State Police trooper has been charged with attempted murder.

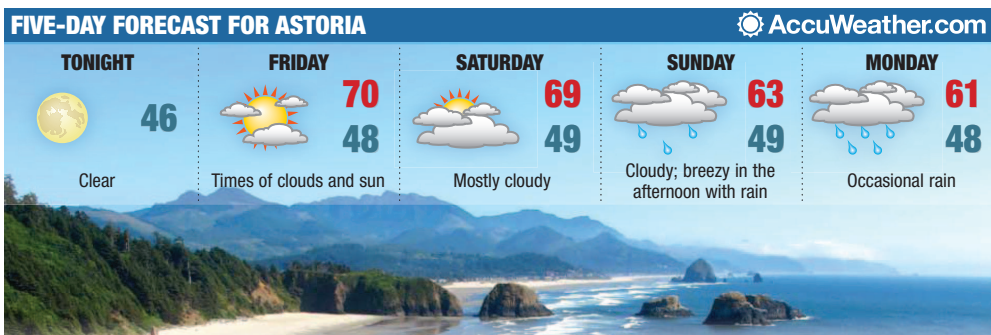
Court records show 30-year-old Edward Dun-

gan of Creswell also faces charges of felon in possession of a firearm, unauthorized use of a vehicle and reckless driving.

Lane County prosecutors say Trooper Gerald Ellis was shot Tuesday afternoon in Creswell after having

pulled over a stolen Toyota Camry. His injuries were not considered life-threatening.

Dungan was arraigned Wednesday in Eugene and a preliminary hearing is set for next week. Court records do not list a defense attorney.

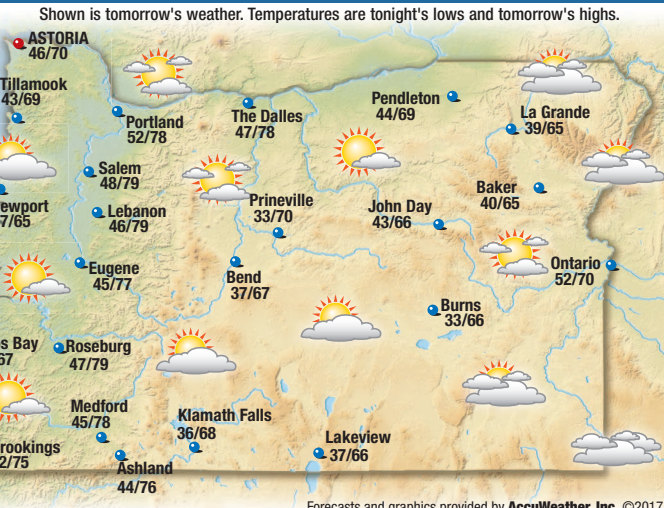

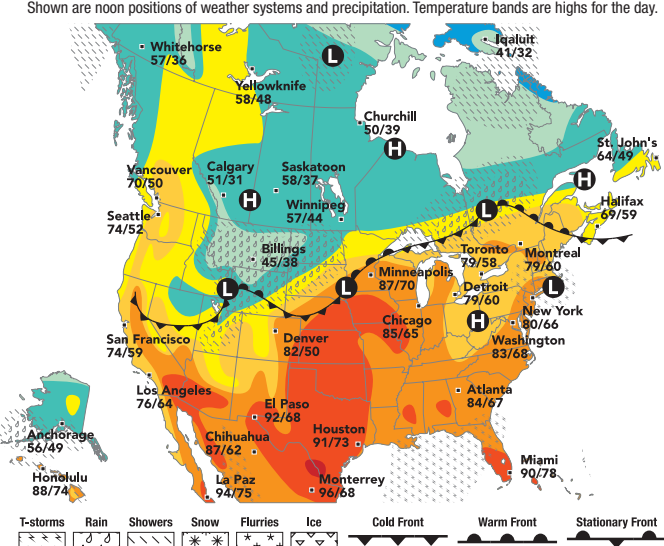
