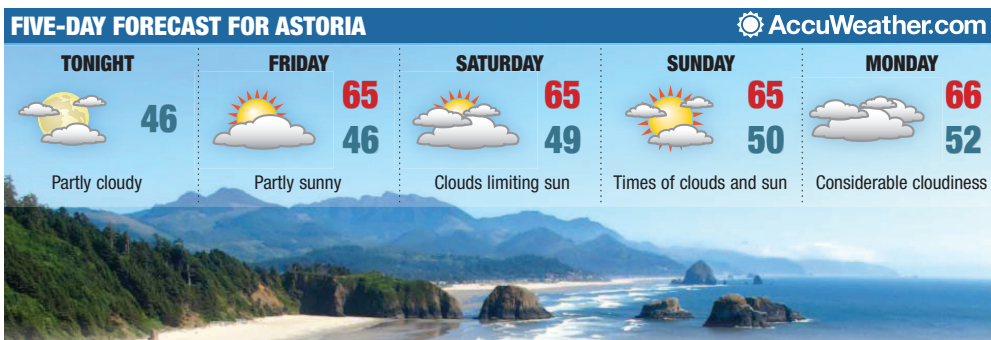

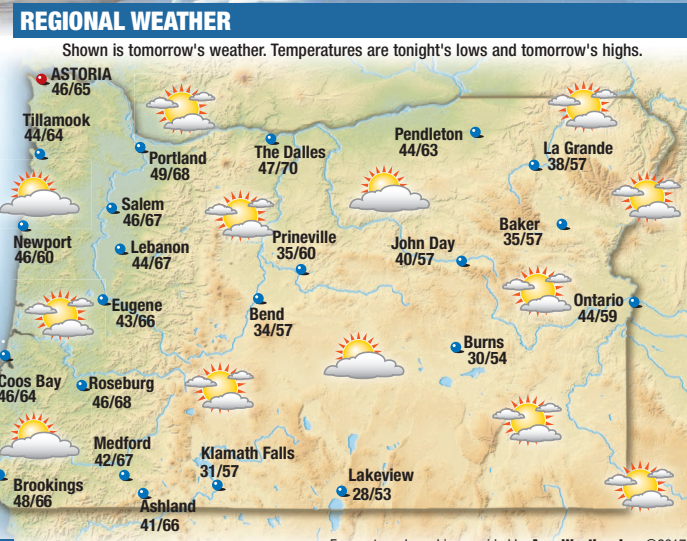

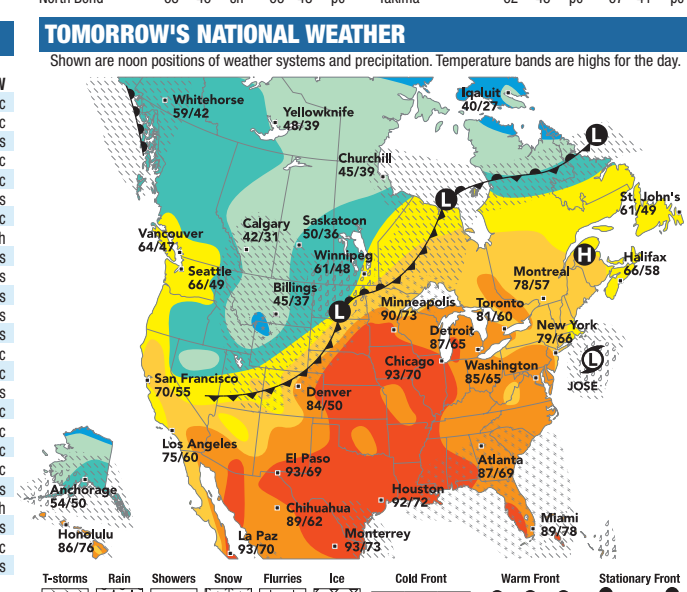

Brown, Hispanic lawmakers make vow to defend Latinos

SALEM — Gov. Kate Brown and Hispanic members of the Legislature vowed Wednesday to defend Latinos in the state, including those who entered the country illegally.

In a ceremony marking Hispanic Heritage Month in Oregon, Brown denounced U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions' comments he made to

law enforcement officials in Oregon. Sessions urged locales whose police don't cooperate with federal immigration agents to reconsider their policies, and said federal grant money cannot be given to sanctuary cities.

"The comments that Attorney General Jeff Sessions made yesterday while in Portland do nothing to make America great," Brown said. "Instead, they incite fear and chaos, and undermine Oregon's work-

force and our economy." State Rep. Teresa Alonso Leon, the first immigrant to be elected to the state Legislature, said the state's Latino population has increased 72 percent since 2000 and the number of businesses owned by Latinos rose by 44 percent between 2007 and 2012, with Latinos in Oregon owning over 6,000 businesses.

"We are growing. We are powerful, and we are here to stay," said Alonso Leon.
