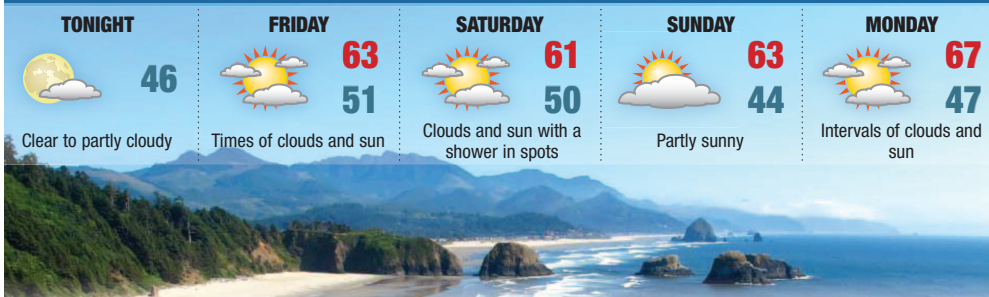
A portion of Logan Road roughly 6 miles south of Miles Crossing will close for a month beginning Oct. 16.

Through Nov. 16, a detour will direct drivers along Lewis and Clark Road.

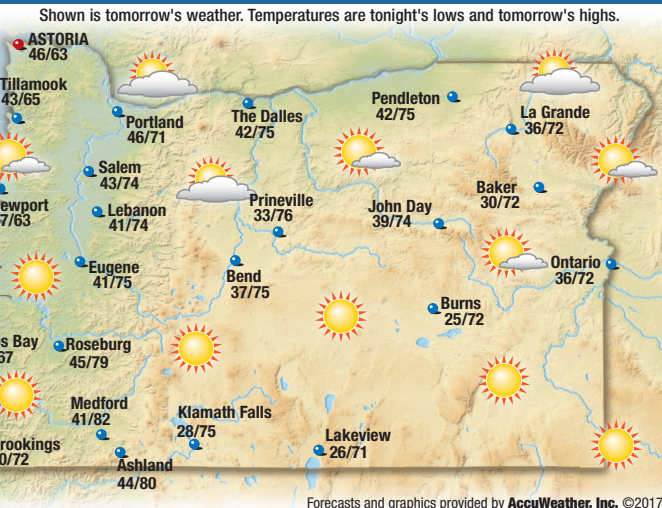

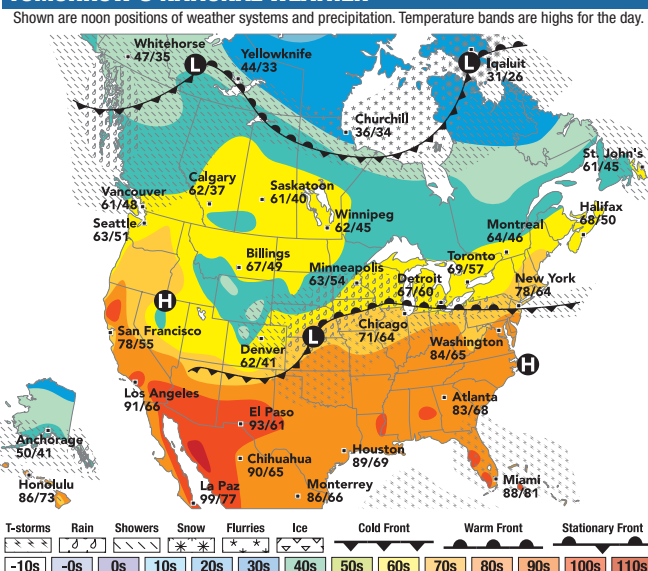
