

Ghadar Party sign is missing

A historical marker memorializing an early 20th century Indian independence group that met in Astoria is missing.

The bronze metal sign attached to a metal pole recognizes the Ghadar Party,

which met in May 1913 at the former site of the Finnish Socialist Hall. Driven by Sikhs, Hindus and Muslims along the west coast, the anti-colonialist party worked toward India's independence from Britain.

Police received a report Friday morning that the

marker, located at Maritime Memorial Park, was stolen. It had not been returned as of this morning.

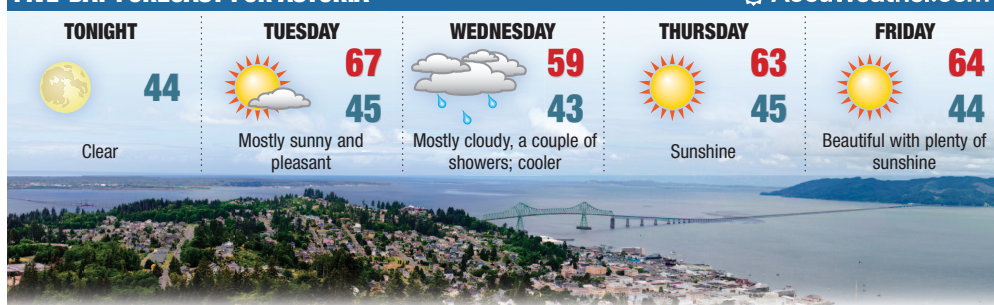

Tonight's Sky: Taurus, the bull, is high overhead. Orion stands to its southeast, with Sirius, the sky's brightest star, low in the south-southeast.

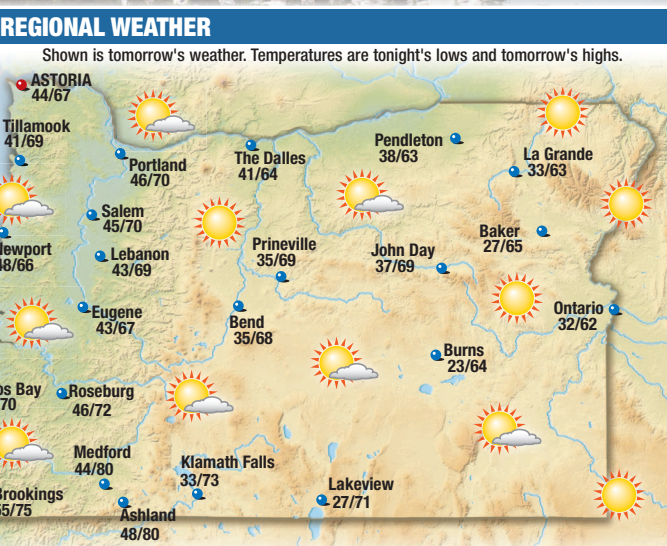

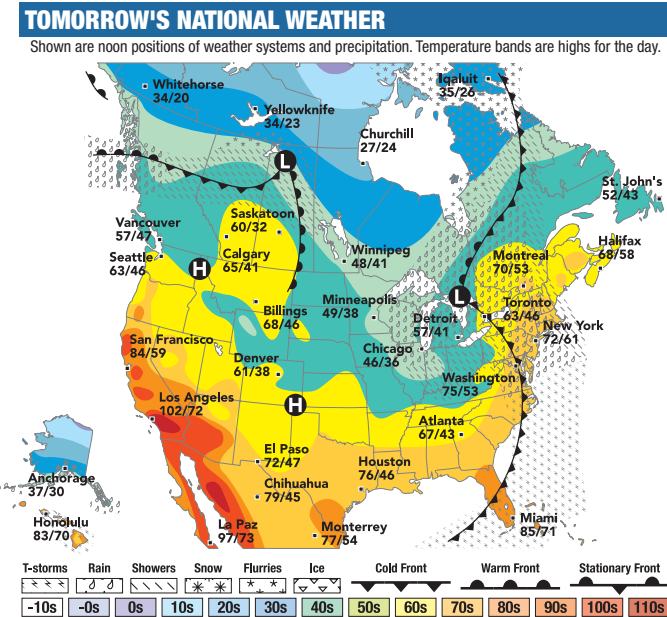

Driver injured in rollover crash south of Seaside

SEASIDE — One person was injured when a Ford Ranger struck an embankment and rolled over on U.S. Highway 101 just south of Seaside about 3:15 p.m. Friday.

Seaside Fire Division Chief David Rankin said no other vehicles were involved, and the driver, who is not being named at this time, was sent to Providence Seaside Hospital with unknown injuries.

The cause is under investi-

gation by Oregon State Police. The highway was closed about 4 p.m. to one lane of traffic. Rankin said he expected the road to be clear within the hour once a tow truck was available to remove the totaled vehicle.

Boil water order lifted in Astoria

Astoria on Saturday lifted a boil water order for some neighborhoods off Highway 202.

The order had applied to Willowdale, Riverpoint, the county fairgrounds, the

Oregon Department of Forestry office and Cavalier Court after a water line break Thursday.

"Bacteriological testing of the water has shown that the water is safe to drink," Eric Bufkin, water quality supervisor for the Astoria Public Works

Department, said in a statement. The broken water line was repaired early Friday, the city said. Public Works staff conducted tests on several water samples to look for contaminants. The city said the test results showed no contamination.
