## Offices close for Veterans Day

In honor of Veterans Day on Saturday, which is being observed on Friday, all federal, state, county and city offices and services, including Astoria, Warrenton, Gearhart, Seaside and Cannon Beach city halls, are closed Friday. All post offices are closed, and there is no mail delivery Friday.

Astoria, Jewell, Knappa, Warrenton/Hammond, Seaside (including Cannon Beach and Gearhart schools) and Ocean Beach School District schools and Clatsop Community College are closed Friday.

The Astoria Library, Seaside Library and all Timberland libraries in Washing-

ton state, including Ilwaco, Ocean Park and Naselle, are closed Saturday. The Warrenton Library is closed Friday.

The Port of Astoria offices and services are closed Friday.

Garbage collection through Recology Western Oregon (covering Astoria, Seaside, Gearhart and Cannon Beach), city of Warrenton garbage collection, and Peninsula Sanitation (covering the Long Beach, Washington, Peninsula) are not affected by the holiday. Recology Western Oregon's transfer station and Peninsula Sanitation's transfer station are open.

The Sunset Pool in Seaside is closed for renovations. The Astoria Aquatic Center is closed Friday.

The Clatsop County Heritage Museum, Oregon Film Museum and Flavel House are open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., and the Carriage House is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Uppertown Firefighters' Museum is closed. Capt. Gray's Port of Play and Lil' Sprouts are open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Fort Clatsop is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Columbia River Maritime Museum is open from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Seaside Museum is open.

Sunset Empire Transportation ("The Bus") is not affected by the holiday.

The Daily Astorian offices are open Friday, and the newspaper printed and delivered as usual.

## Forest Service waives fees for Veterans Day

The U.S. Forest Service is waiving fees at day-use recreation sites across Oregon and Washington state in honor of Veterans Day.

"We honor our veterans each Nov. 11 and every other day of the year," said Jim Pena, regional forester, in a statement. "We hope that this

time will serve as a way for our veterans and other visitors to find our national forests as a year-round respite, a place where they can time out for themselves."

The fee waiver will occur Saturday through Sunday and includes many picnic areas, boat launches, trail heads and visitor centers. Fees for camping, cabin rentals, heritage

expeditions and other permits still apply.

The closest national forests to Clatsop County are the Siuslaw National Forest south of Lincoln City, the Mount Hood and Willamette National Forests farther inland and the Gifford Pinchot National Forest in Washington state north of the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area.

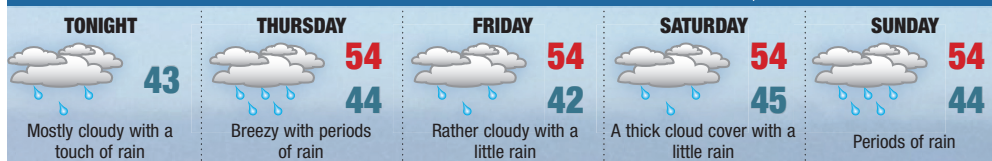
Astoria Art Loft is inviting active duty and retired military personnel to display art work and military memo-

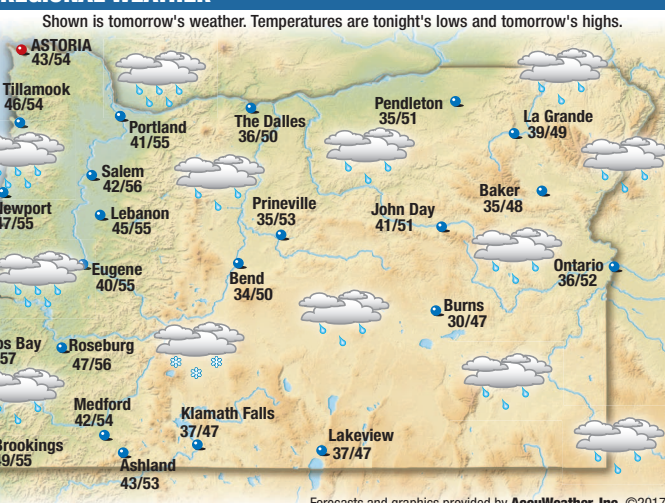

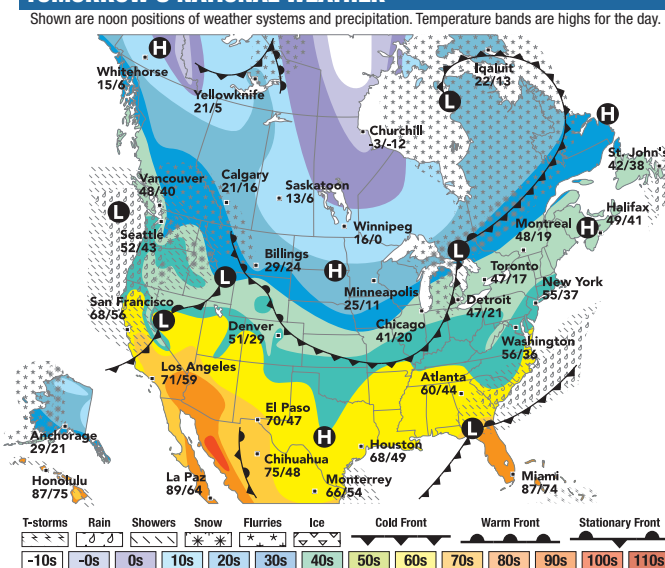
