Elk harvested after shucking net

Gearhart elk incidents draw response

GEARHART — Residents were distressed after seeing elk encumbered by a tomato cage and a volleyball net over the past few weeks, enough so to contact Ore-

gon Department of Fish and Wildlife to find a remedy.

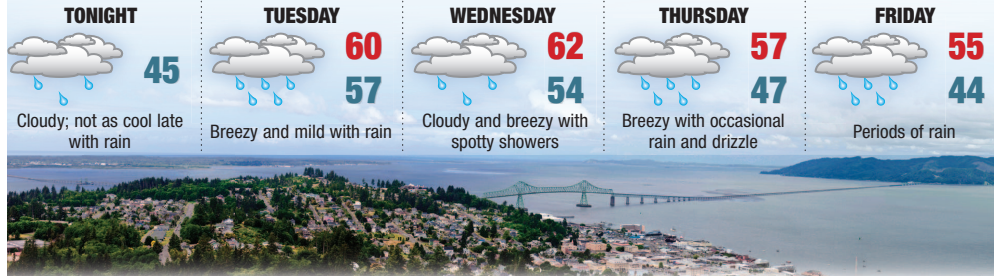
A bull with a volleyball net on its horns and a cow with the metal cage were reported and photographed throughout the community.

The elk with the tomato cage appears to have shucked it free, wildlife biologist Herman Biederbeck of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife said Friday. "We can't seem to find an elk with that thing on it anymore."

The bull with the volleyball net transferred the remnants of the net to another bull, which was subsequently legally harvested by an elk hunter with a Saddle Mountain tag, the department reported. The bull that originally had the net in its antlers is now walking around free of any adornments.

"It appears like we have no more issues," Biederbeck said.

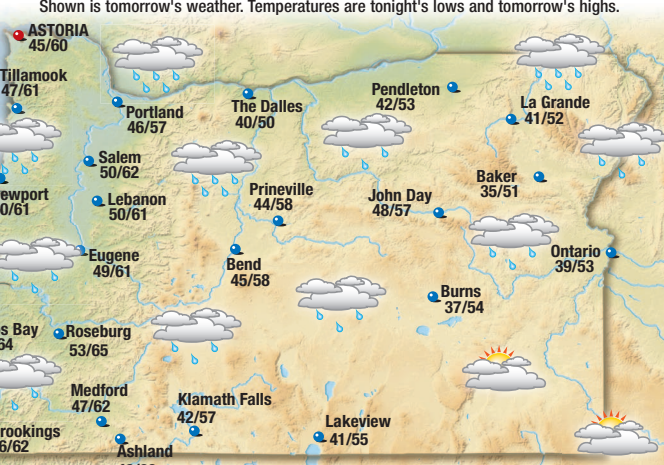

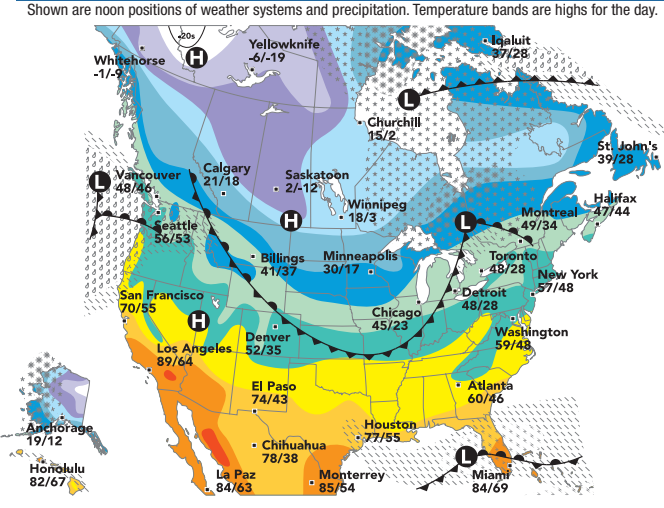

Some Thanksgiving holiday closures begin Wednesday

In observance of Thanksgiving Day, all federal and state offices are closed Thursday.

County and city offices and services, including Astoria, Warrenton, Gearhart, Seaside and Cannon Beach city halls, are closed Thursday and Friday. All U.S. post offices are closed Thursday, and there is no mail delivery.

Astoria, Jewell, Knappa, Seaside (including Cannon Beach and Gearhart) and Warrenton/Hammond schools are closed Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Ocean Beach School District schools and Clatsop Community College are closed Thursday and Friday.

The Astoria Library, Seaside Library, Warrenton Library, and all Timberland libraries in Washington,

including Ilwaco, Ocean Park and Naselle, are closed Thursday and Friday.

The Port of Astoria offices and services are closed Thursday and Friday.

For Recology Western Oregon (covering Astoria, Seaside, Gearhart and Cannon Beach) garbage collection customers who have service on Thursday and Friday, pickup will be a day late; the transfer station is closed Thursday. Peninsula Sanitation (covering the Long Beach, Washington, Peninsula) customers whose regular pickup day is Thursday will have their garbage picked up on Friday, pickup will be a day late; the transfer station is closed Thursday. Customers of the city of Warrenton who have service on Thursday will have their garbage picked up on Friday.

The Sunset Pool in Sea-

side is closed for renovations. The Astoria Aquatic Center is open from 5 to 11 a.m. Thursday.

The Clatsop County Heritage Museum, Oregon Film Museum, Flavel House, and Carriage House are closed Thursday. The Uppertown Firefighters' Museum is closed. Capt. Pacific Power offers winter heating, billing tips

With the National Weather Service predicting a colder-than-average winter, utility provider Pacific Power is reminding customers of tips to heat households efficiently and a program to spread out energy bills.

"You are battling the elements," Barb Coughlin, Pacific Power's vice president for customer service, said in a news release.

"Cold air sneaks in and

warm air gets out. So the first thing you can do is seal all windows or doors before the cold really sets in. This can be done inexpensively now and the difference will show up once temperatures start dipping below freezing."

Pacific Power recommends customers set thermostats as low as comfortable, with a goal of 68 degrees Fahrenheit. Use space heaters sparingly, as they can run up energy bills. Clean or replace furnace filters and schedule routine

maintenance for efficient airflow. Move furniture blocking intakes and heat registers.

Pacific Power offers Equal Pay, a program in which energy costs are averaged out over a year to make bills more predictable. Customers can enroll in Equal Pay online at pacificpower.net/equalpay, on the utility's mobile app or by phone at 888-221-7070.

Pacific Power also offers energy efficiency consultation and financial incentives to upgrade home systems.
