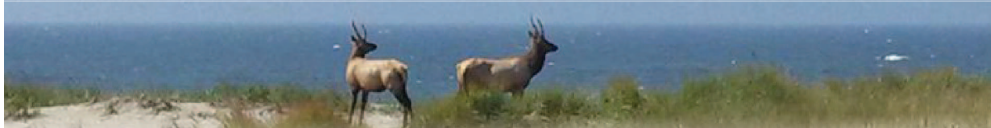

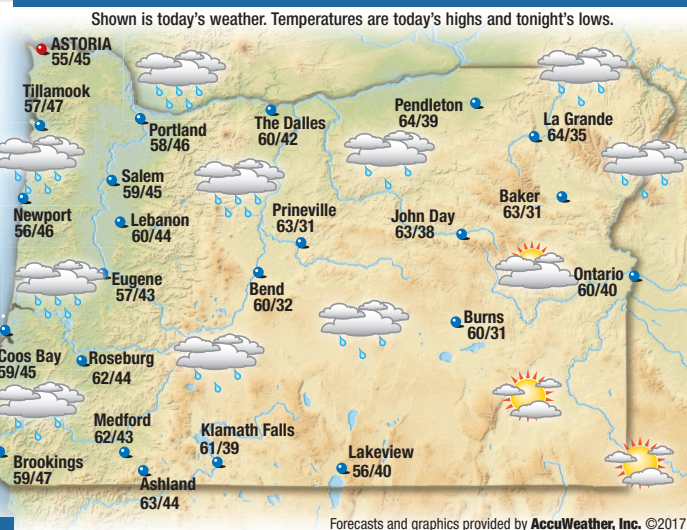

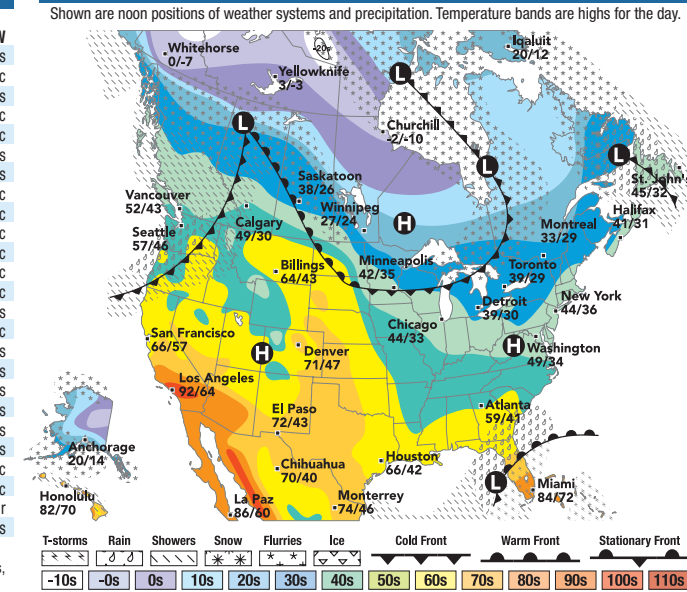

The Warrenton Marina is holding a closed bid auction for derelict or abandoned boats that marina staff seized earlier this fall.

to the 72-foot-long 1967 sailing vessel Master Chris. When the boats were listed for sale in early November, the prices reflected the fees owners owed the marina. Harbormaster Jane Sweet said she was hoping to recoup some of the costs to the marina.

derelict or abandoned boats are a problem at public marinas across Oregon, but disposing of them can be expensive. Often, marinas attempt to sell the boats, but rarely recoup what they have lost in potential revenue or what they have spent to maintain and store the boats in the absence of an active owner, according to the state.

Seven boats are for sale, ranging from a wooden sailboat, the 26-foot-long Arluk,
