School football field Thursday afternoon as U.S. Highway 101 drivers pulled over to snap photos. The elk appeared to leave droppings on the field and the track surrounding it.

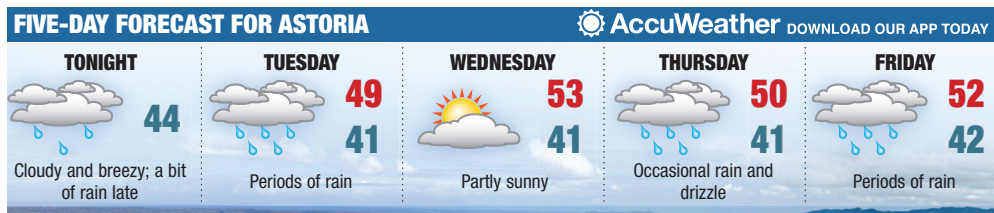
"Is this unusual?" said Cherry Horton, who was visiting South County from Seattle. "This is incredible."

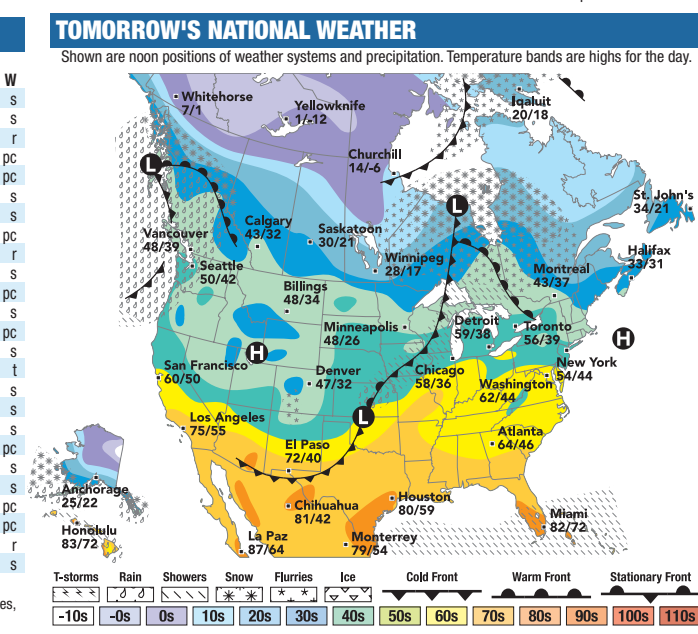
