Firefighters to return this week from aiding with California blazes



Oregon firefighters, including about a dozen from departments in Clatsop County, are starting to return Tuesday after battling blazes Southern California for nearly two weeks.

The 15 strike teams from

across the state have assisted with a number of fires, especially the Thomas Fire burning near Ventura. After burning more than 270,000 acres, it is 50 percent contained. It was the third time this year local firefighters deployed to fires outside the county.

"Our teams have played an important role in helping our neighbors to the south, and all of Oregon can be proud of the professionalism and effectiveness of our resources while dealing with these difficult fires," State Fire Marshal Jim Walker said in a statement.





Former crewman sues skipper from 'Deadliest Catch' show

PORTLAND — A former seaman has sued a fisherman who starred in Discovery Channel's "Deadliest Catch: Dungeon Cove" show, alleging the man was negligent and caused severe injury.

Nolan Dean filed a suit Dec. 6 in federal court against Gary Ripka, nicknamed "The Ripper," who appeared in the

Catch: Dungeon Cove" in September 2016.

Dean claims his arm was broken because Ripka was negligent and his ship wasn't seaworthy, The Oregonian reported.

Dean was working in the back of Ripka's ship, Western Breeze, on May 30, 2015, when Ripka activated a hydraulic control, the complaint states. Dean's arm got

ple bones broke in his arm. Ripka declined to talk about the specifics of the case, but said he has a history of

safe fishing expeditions.

"Our operation has a reputation for being safe. Our crew members know that," Ripka said. "Guys have no problem coming on our boat because they know it's safe."
