Dale Frandsen, 82, passed away at his home in Seaside on Dec. 23, 2017.

He was born May 5, 1935, in Glasgow, Montana, to Earl and Dorothy Ahl Frandsen.

Dale spent his early years on his family's farm near Sisseton, South Dakota, where he also attended school. In 1950 he moved to Astoria, Oregon, and graduated from Astoria High School in 1954.

He served in the Army, and was a graduate of Elgin Watch and Clockmakers College in Elgin, Illinois

Frandsen started in the jewelry business working for Ulaine's Jewelry in Astoria and Del Moore Jewelry in Seaside. In 1961, he pur-

chased the store and changed the name to Frandsen's Jewelry. In 1997, Dale retired from the jewelry store.

On Sept. 24, 1960, he married Shirley Wilson in Astoria. They made their home in Seaside, where they lived the rest of their lives. In retirement, Dale was able to golf, drive his Corvette and spend time with his wife of nearly 54 years.

# Series of quakes near Mount St. Helens

A series of nine earthquakes originating near Mount St. Helens early Wednesday was felt throughout Clark County and as far away as Seattle, according to the U.S. Geological Survey.

The first earthquake hit at 12:36 a.m. and had a magnitude of 3.9, and was followed at 12:39 a.m. by a 2.7 magnitude quake.

Seven other smaller earthquakes followed, ranging in magnitude from 1.0 to 1.9. The last quake was recorded at 3:55 a.m.

The cluster of quakes was centered on the Bean Creek drainage northeast of Mount St. Helens and about 3 miles east of Spirit Lake. The depth of the earthquakes ranged from 9.4 kilometers to 11.1 kilometers, the USGS reported.

# Coast Guard helicopter rescues man suffering medical issue from reef near Depoe Bay

DEPOE BAY — A 19-yearold man suffering from an unknown medical issue was rescued by helicopter just south of Depoe Bay.

The Register-Guard reported

the Depoe Bay Fire District says low tide Tuesday allowed the man to be rescued from a reef in Big Whale Cover that is typically underwater.

A Coast Guard helicopter made the rescue once firefighters had responded to the scene.

Firefighters stabilized the patient with help from ambulance personnel within 10 minutes of receiving the dispatch call at 3:52 p.m.

The fire district says the man was taken to a local hospital for assessment.


