Harry was born in Astoria, Oregon, on Jan. 8, 1938, to Harry Grant Freeman and Edith Senja Lindberg Freeman. He died in Hawthorn, Nevada, Dec. 17, 2017, due to health issues.

Shortly after graduating from Astoria High School in 1957, Harry joined the Marine Corps. He served a great deal of time in Subic Bay, Philippines.

Receiving an honorable discharge in 1963, Harry returned to his hometown, Astoria, where he worked in the commercial logging and fishing industries, and he owned his own drag fishing boat, The Priscilla.

In 1966, Harry joined the International Longshore and Warehouse Union Local 50 in Astoria. He later transferred to Local 13 in Long Beach, California, in 1985, and in 2000 retired as a crane operator and

moved to Luning, Nevada, where he owned property for several years.

Harry was active in the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and was the post commander of his VFW until his deteriorating health required him to step down.

Harry is survived by his wife of 30 years, Mary McDevitt Freeman; daughter Priscilla Van Sluis, and grandsons Cameron and Brandon Van Sluis, of Vancouver, Washington; son Lesley Freeman of Texas; stepdaughters Beverly Garcia of Florida, Lori Duckett of California, and Judy LaFountain of Luning; step-grandchildren Joshua Fazekas, Ken Pate, Ashley Demarco, and Mathew Keen; step-great-grandchildren Alexis LaFountain and Jack Demarco; and friends Rich and Mike Vetricke.

Services have been held. Harry is buried in Mina, Nevada.

Man robbed at gunpoint in Astoria

An Astoria man allegedly robbed another man at gunpoint on Marine Drive Monday night.

John William Kelley, 39, of Astoria, was driving west on the road with a man and woman in the car. He then pulled over near the KFC restaurant.

Kelley allegedly then pointed what appeared to be a black semi-automatic weapon at the male passenger and demanded his wallet. After surrendering the wallet, Kelley told the man to get out of the car.

After speaking with witnesses, Astoria police identified Kelley as a suspect and arrested him at his home. Officers found

a black paintball gun inside the residence, Interim Police Chief Geoff Spalding said.

The woman in the car denied having knowledge of the planned robbery, according to an affidavit.

Kelley has been charged with second-degree robbery. He is scheduled to be arraigned in Clatsop County Circuit Court later this month.

Flood warning Thursday in Seaside

Officials are warning of strong swells in Seaside on Thursday.

The swells are expected to begin near midnight and peak midday Thursday, creating large waves and beach erosion, according to the National Weather Service. Tides likely will reach as high as 10 1/2

feet and breaking waves of 35 to 45 feet may occur at sea.

Flooding is expected in low-lying areas. The event will likely be similar to floods caused by high swells in the area in December of 2015 that impacted structures. Willapa Bay, Nehalem, Tillamook and Florence will also be affected. "Structures and roads located immediately at

beach level will potentially be flooded or impacted by debris," according to a press release from the weather service. "Many cove access beaches, jetties, and rocky outcroppings will be covered by deep water."

Residents are advised to prepare property and avoid beaches and areas that may be cut off to escape routes.
