

wake her children just before the break of dawn to catch the low tides for digging razor clams. Even her youngest children would dig with her. She continued this tradition with her grandchildren.

She loved being with children and playing games, singing silly songs, and making quilts for each of her grandchildren. Her favorite movie was "The Sound of Music." Family was very important to her.

Alice had a very strong faith, and loved to attend daily mass at St Mary, Star of the Sea Parish. She taught PE and coached volleyball at Star of the Sea School.

After five years of being single, she fell in love again. Charles Turina won her heart,
