## Soldier dies of gunshot wound at Camp Rilea

A soldier died at Camp Rilea on Wednesday of what appears to be an accidental gunshot wound, according to the Clatsop County Sheriff's Office.

The sheriff's office is investigating the shooting and has not released the soldier's name.

"Members of a regular U.S. Army unit conducting training at Camp Rilea reported a gunshot discharge in the housing area," the sheriff's office said in a release.

Maj. Stephen Bomar, a spokesman for the Oregon Military Department, said the shooting happened after training hours. The sheriff's office

is in charge of the investigation, with assistance from Army investigators, Bomar said.

The soldier was taken to Columbia Memorial Hospital, where he was declared dead.

Camp Rilea in Warrenton is the primary training facility for the Oregon National Guard.

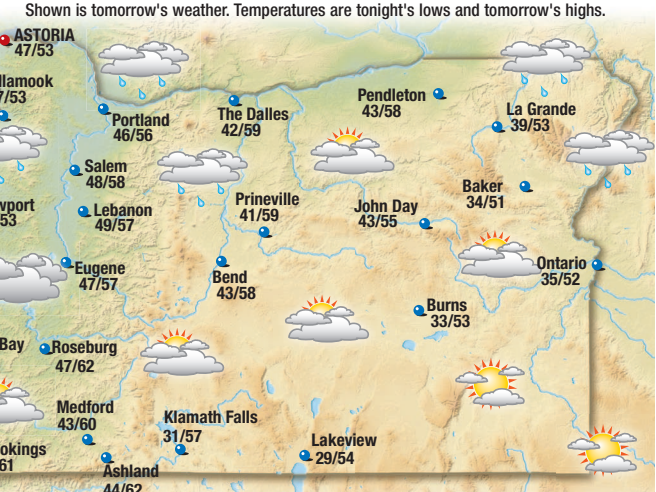

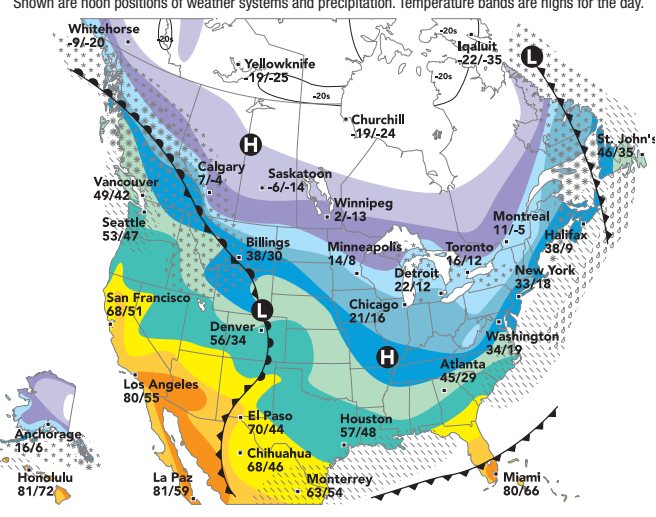

He is survived by his wife, Dolores (Dodo) Boisvert; children Barney and Peggy Boisvert; grandchildren Nikolai, Lindsay, Gabriel and Emery Boisvert; and siblings Thomas Wilfred Boisvert and Renee (Boisvert) Patterson. Jerry is preceded in death by his parents, Wilfred Louis Boisvert and Bernadette Vermette Boisvert; and sister, Susan (Boisvert) Lord.

Coincidence also took Dodo to Chignik in 1974, and Jerry and Dodo worked there together for several seasons. When Dodo proposed marriage, Jerry accepted, and the two were married in Seattle on July 10, 1976.

Growing up in Lewiston, Jerry attended a public kindergarten before attending the local parochial school, St. Pierre, for first through eighth grades. He attended St. Dominic's Regional High School, graduating in 1968.

Jerry was a competitive and entrepreneurial child; he played baseball, and began playing soccer in high school, earning soccer awards in high school and college. For many years, Jerry and his brother worked a newspaper route in Lewiston. Jerry translated the newspaper route into summer and winter jobs in the community, mowing lawns, shoveling snow and caring for homes.

Fisheries brought Jerry and Dodo to the Oregon Coast in 1977. They lived first in Newport, where Barney was born in 1980, and then in Warrenton, where their daughter, Peggy, was born in 1982. Jerry continued to work in fisheries, retiring from Pacific Coast Seafood in 2017.

Jerry brought his coaching instincts and love of soccer to Warrenton, where he helped found the Lower Columbia Youth Soccer Association in 1984, and slowly built the Warrenton Soccer Complex while facilitating, coaching and officiating soccer at all levels.

Upon finishing high school, Jerry began committing himself to the Brothers of the Sacred Heart, a teaching order of the Catholic Church. He attended Providence College as a divinity student and a student of educational arts.

After graduating from Providence College in 1972, Jerry spent a year as a novitiate of the Brothers. Feeling that the Brothers were not present enough in the community, Jerry chose to leave the order in 1973, and began a solo trip across the U.S., taking odd jobs to fund his travel.
