EPA looks into chemical odor inside Seaside home

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is investigating a strong chemical smell inside a Seaside home. Seaside fire personnel responded to a report of the smell inside the residence

on the 900 block of Avenue K about 8:30 p.m. Saturday. A hazardous materials team from the Astoria Fire Department joined the investigation Monday and used general ventilation techniques. Officials then requested

the help of EPA officials from Seattle and Portland, who began air monitoring and sampling Wednesday. Investigators believe the issue is limited to the interior of the home, where the residents have been evacuated, according to a press release.

"Mark has spent his career building bridges between community banks and the busi-

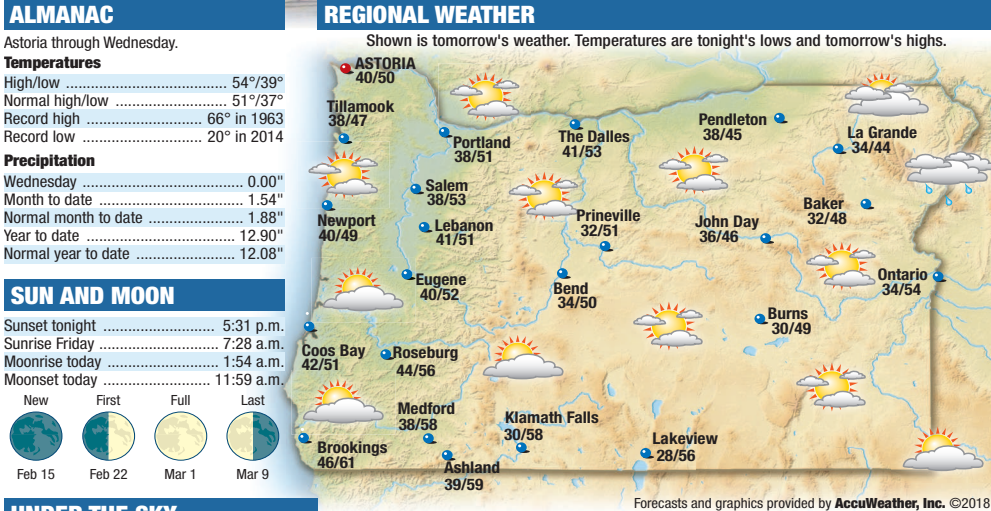
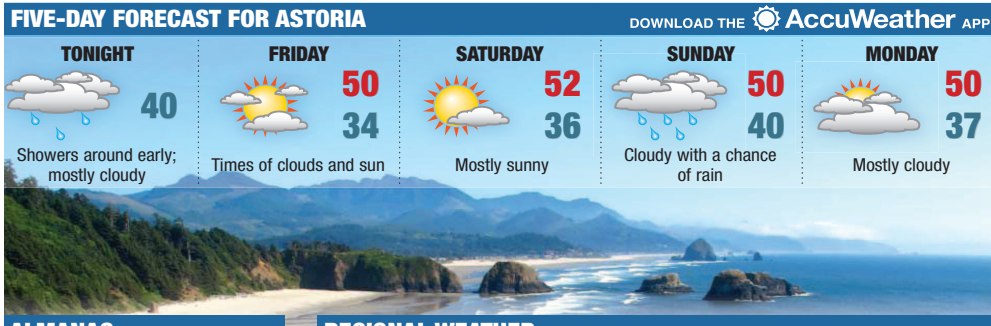

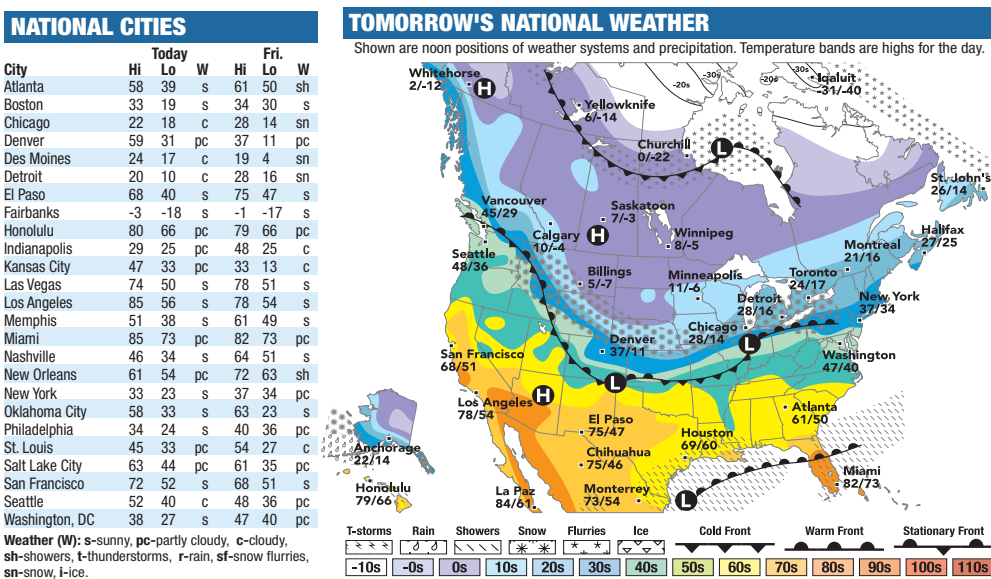
Tonight's Sky: To the upper right of Taurus lies the open cluster, M45, the Pleiades.

Timothy Allen Lewis, of Astoria, Oregon, slipped the surly bonds of earth on Jan. 31, 2018 at home surrounded by family and friends. Born in Grinnell, Iowa, on Nov. 11, 1952, and raised in Gulfport, Mississippi, Tim was a dedicated and loving partner, father, brother and friend to all.

A graduate of Gulfport High School, Tim continued his education at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College before trying his luck at the University of Southern Mississippi. He spent his career working in information technology with Dell Computer Corp., Coca Cola Enterprise and Western National Mutual Insurance Co.

Tim was an avid reader of science-fiction novels, dog lover and animal therapy volunteer, enthusiast of golf and naps — often at the same time, singer of rock 'n' roll tunes from his youth, and a veritable connoisseur of Monty Python, and how one's father smelt of elderberries.

A foodie at heart, Tim often lamented missing the shrimp po'boys from Lil Ray's on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Living in Kansas,

Oklahoma, Colorado and Minnesota only made his lack of good seafood more acute. Moving to Astoria in 2014 helped provide some level of relief, but it never replaced his love for the food from his youth.

Tim is survived by his wife and best friend, Lucy Dupree, and their Goldendoodle, Reilly; his daughter, Courtney Stombeck, her husband, Brad, and their two children, Barrett and Emmett of Atlanta, Georgia; his son, Fletcher Lewis and his wife, Emily, of San Diego; his sister, Rebecca Lewis of Barcelona, Spain; his brother, Randy Lewis, of Crystal River, Florida; and friends, whom he considered family, Vicki Reese and Brian Hartley of Astoria, Oregon.

He was preceded in death by his brother, Edward B. Lewis, Jr.; and his parents, Dorothy Allen Lewis and Edward Bedea Lewis.
