About 550 people watched as four local young women were crowned at the 2018 Miss Clatsop County Scholarship Program competition Feb. 3 at the Seaside Convention Center, where \$6,850 in scholarships was awarded.

Haylie Moon, 22, of Cannon Beach walked away with \$1,550 in scholarships. She was named Miss Clatsop County 2018, Overall Miss Interview winner, recipient of the Miss Oregon Alexis Mather Service Above Self Award for the Miss Division, and the Miss Congeniality Award. She is a 2014 grad-

uate of Seaside High School, and is enrolled at University of Portland.

The title of Miss North Coast went to Aubrey McMahan, 19, of Knappa, who is attending Clatsop Community College. She also won the overall Miss Talent award, and her total scholarships for the weekend were \$1,125.

Named Runner-Up in the Miss Division was Kayla Woodward, 22, a 2014 graduate of Astoria High School. She also won the Overall Evening Wear competition, netting a \$575 scholarship.

Winning the Miss Clatsop County's Outstanding Teen 2018 title was Caitlin Hill-

man, 15, of Gearhart, a sophomore at Seaside High School. She will receive a total of \$625 after also winning the overall Teen Interview and Talent categories.

The Miss North Coast's Outstanding Teen title went to Taryn Miller, 15, of Scappoose. She was also voted Teen Congeniality by her peers, and shared the Teen award for the Miss Oregon 2016 Alexis Mather Service Above Self Award. She will receive a \$700 scholarship.

Riley Mitchell, 15, of Warrenton, was named Teen runner-up and Overall Teen Eveningwear Winner, and netted the Teen Marketing Award.

She attends Warrenton High School, and qualifies for \$400 in scholarships.

By random draw, Galilea Casarrubias was named Miss Clatsop County's Princess; Miss North Coast's Princess is Tori Miller.

Moon, McMahan, Hillman and Miller will move forward to the Miss Oregon and Oregon's Outstanding Teen competition in late June in Seaside.

Grant finances equipment at Coast Community Radio

Coast Community Radio, has received a \$10,000 grant from the Templin Foundation of Pacific County, Washington. CCR Director Joanne Rideout wrote the grant for money to replace an important piece of equipment at the tower on Megler Mountain in Chinook, Washington.

Station Manager Graham Nystrom will admin-

ister the funds by purchasing a new Davicom, a device that monitors and communicates information about the overall health of multiple functions at the tower's 5,000-watt Harris transmitter. It also allows the station to remotely control certain aspects of the transmitter from the studio.

The purchase and installation will take a couple of months.
