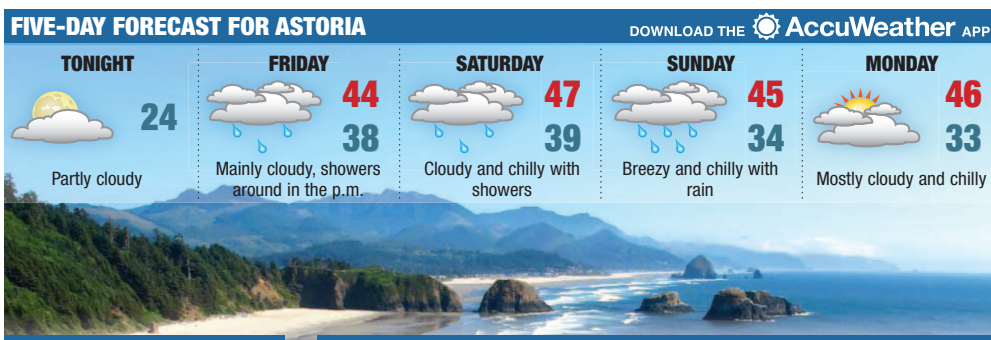
Icy conditions close schools in Astoria

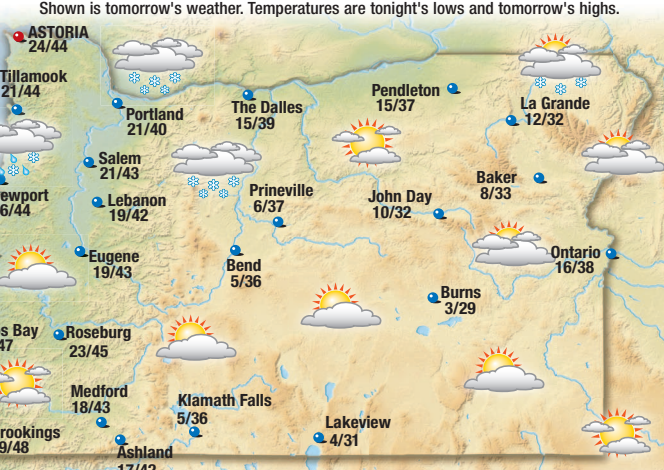

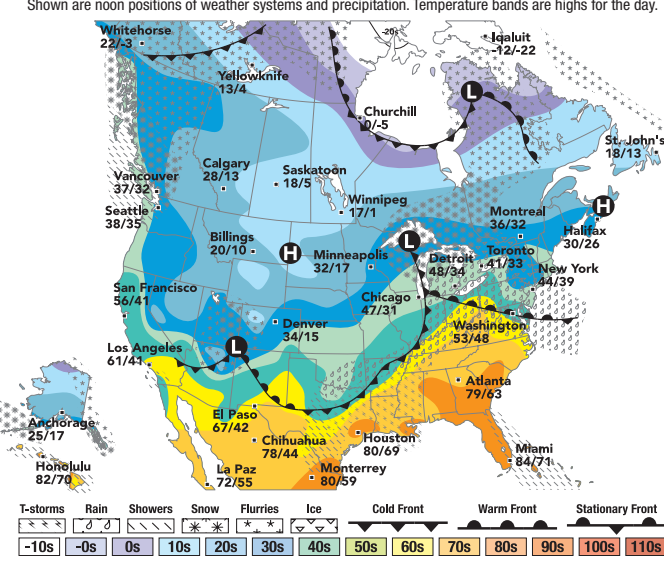

Spring Chinook fishing season set

Oregon and Washington state fishery managers set spring Chinook salmon seasons for the Columbia River Wednesday.

This year's run of spring Chinook — a forecast of 248,500 — is expected to be higher than last year's return.

Recreational fishing is set to begin March 1 through April 7 on the Lower Columbia River from Buoy 10 near the river's mouth upstream to Beacon Rock. Bank fishing will be allowed during this same time from Buoy 10 to the

fishing deadline at Bonneville Dam.

Fishermen will have a daily bag limit of two adipose fin-clipped (hatchery) adult salmon, either Chinook or coho, or hatchery steelhead in combination, of which no more than one may be a Chinook salmon. Up to five hatchery jack salmon per day can be caught in Oregon.

Beginning March 1 and continuing through June 15, fishermen will be able to fish in Youngs Bay and Blind Slough/Knappa Slough on days when the main stem Columbia River below Bon-

neville Dam is open to recreational Chinook harvest with daily bag limits on adult salmon and steelhead that will be the same as the main stem limits.

On the Willamette River, fishery managers expect a return of 53,800 fish, up from last year's return of 50,800. Beginning March 1, recreational fishermen will be allowed to land up to two adult hatchery salmon or steelhead in combination below Willamette Falls. Above the falls, two adult hatchery salmon and three hatchery steelhead may be retained in the daily bag.
