I wonder at times whether it's fair to ask her to wait or even to "allow" her to wait. I guess a part of me thinks I should let her go because I love her so much. I would hate to see her suffer further, and there's a chance

my trial will not go as I hope. How should I handle this? - Lover in Limbo

Dear Lover in Limbo: You want your wife to have happiness even if it's without you. That's love. Though I admire your willingness to selflessly "let her go," you can't make that decision for her. You two are a team, united in marriage for better or worse. Talk to her; express your feelings, and let her know it's OK for her to express hers, whatever they are. Have faith that she will tell you honestly.
