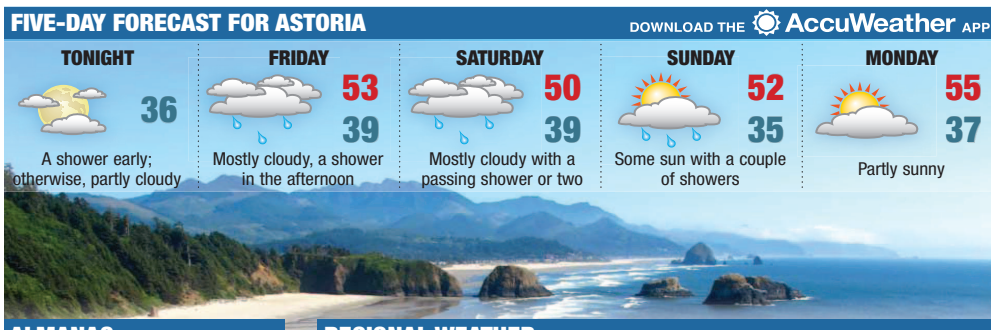

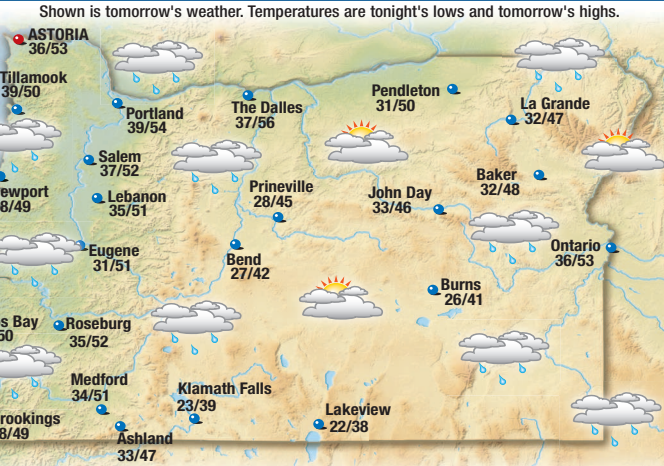

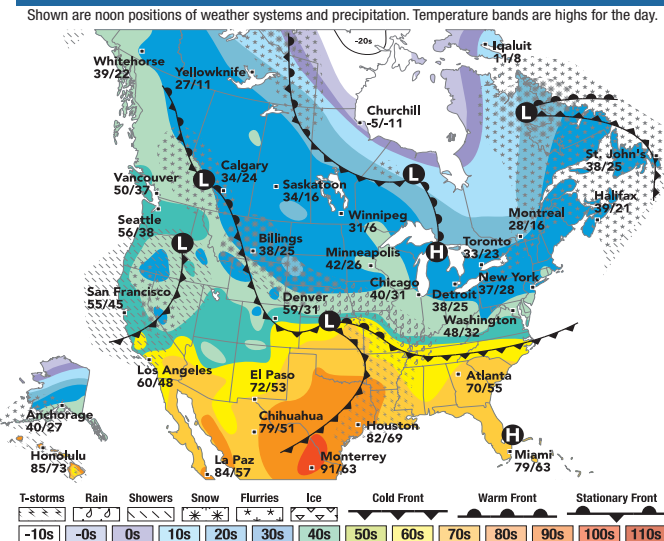

Knappa hosts school safety forum

KNAPPA — The Knappa School District will hold a student and school safety forum Tuesday at Knappa High School.

"We want to hear your ideas on how we can better service our students and

the community with regard to safety issues," the district said in a release.

The forum comes less than a month after a student was removed from the high school after making threatening remarks and a week after a national student walkout protesting gun violence.

The meeting will include information on policies, safety plans, threats of violence, privacy laws, student drills, police partnerships and mental health, along with public comment.

The forum is at 6:30 p.m. in the Knappa High School gym.

James Albert Hansen Astoria

Oct. 4, 1924 — March 7, 2018

James Albert Hansen died of natural causes at his home in Astoria, Oregon. He is survived by his daughters, Anastasia and Andrea Hansen; his sister, Jo Anne Troxel; and his niece, Allison Troxel, of Bozeman, Montana; as well as many cousins, nephews and nieces.

He was born in Plentywood, Montana, to Andrew Hansen, a wheat farmer and flour mill owner, and Marie Chapman Hansen, whose father opened up eastern Montana for homesteading.

Jim joined the Navy during World War II, serving in the band as a trumpet player, and was sent to the Navy School of Music in Washington, D.C. He went on to play in many jazz and big bands until ultimately returning to Montana to attend the University of Montana on the GI Bill, majoring in music and history.

He was a beloved music teacher in Montana schools, as well as schools in Oregon. He was always proud that many of his students went on to play in prestigious orchestras, as well as attending Eastman School of Music and Juilliard School of Music. He kept in touch with many of his students, and they were visitors to his home whenever they were in town.

He lived in Astoria for 45 years, and was a beloved and well-known figure around town. Because of his knowledge of music, he was

a disc jockey at the local radio station, playing and commenting on jazz, which he loved. He also directed the opera in Portland several summers, and loved the opportunity. Anything having to do with music was his specialty.

He was also proud of the Astoria band he took to Europe, and always talked about the wonderful reception they received, and how impressed people were by this local band. He gave great credit to the parents and other teachers who helped make this grand adventure possible. He often played a recording of that band, remembering with fondness the great students who made that trip so memorable.

He spent his last years reading history, watching and commenting on the news, taking long walks around Astoria, where he often met old students and friends for conversation. He especially liked the Astoria Senior Center, where he went to play chess, have lunch and talk with friends.

For his easy humor, great wit and keen intellect, he will be remembered, as well as for his generosity and great kindness.

A celebration of life will be held at the Astoria Senior Center March 31 at 4 p.m. We welcome all who knew him to bring your stories and musical instruments.
