





Tugboat and barge reportedly hit boat on Columbia River

PORTLAND — Officials say a tugboat and barge hit a smaller vessel on the Columbia River, tossing the smaller boat's occupants

The Oregonian reported that there were no injuries in the Wednesday morning collision. Coast Guard Petty Officer Amanda Nor-

cross said the incident happened downriver of Longview, Washington, near Willow Grove

Norcross said the tugboat and barge reportedly hit the 20-foot pleasure craft and caused the smaller vessel to capsize.

She said there was zero visibility at the time because of thick fog.

Norcross said someone picked up the two people who had been fishing from the smaller boat and took them to shore.

Coast Guard investigators from Portland are looking into what happened and whether any enforcement action needs to be taken, she said.

They also built a very strong community of friends in Gearhart, where Jean enjoyed volunteering with the local American Association of University Women group, weekly walks and exercise classes with friends, gardening, golfing and enjoying her 5 p.m. "medicinal" glass of red wine.

Marty and Jean were able to spend many vears of their retirement traveling abroad

together, which was an adventure they looked forward to planning each vear. Jean was a devout Catholic all her life and lived as a very kindhearted, compassionate, gracious, sweet wife, mother and friend, and lived these qualities until the end of
