Lillard's 41 points lift **Blazers past Pelicans**

NEW ORLEANS — Damian Lillard couldn't get out of New Orleans fast enough. The Pelicans could only wish the Portland All-Star had been in even more of hurry.

Lillard scored 20 of his 41 points in the fourth quarter to lift the Trail Blazers to a 107-103 victory on Tuesday night, then booked a flight straight home in hopes of arriving in time for the birth of his first child.

who's been Lillard, expecting a son, said he found out when he got back to the locker room after the game that his girlfriend had gone into labor. He said the message was along the lines of: "Get home."

He said he'd head straight

to the hospital as soon as he landed.

"I'm excited. I've been waiting," Lillard said.

He'd stuck with his team as long as he could because the Blazers are in a tight playoff race, and the two teams closest behind them in the standings — Oklahoma City and New Orleans — are the past two they've played. They beat both to strengthen their hold on third place, moving 2 ½ games ahead of the Thunder and 3 ½ ahead of New Orleans with eight games left.

Portland coach Terry Stotts said he planned to rest Lillard to start the fourth quarter, when the Pelicans led by four. Lillard asked to stay in the game. "We were just fighting, fighting, fighting, and I was like, 'Man, we've got to roll," Lillard said.


Harrisburg tops Seaside, 9-2
