Alcohol suspected in fatal Highway 26 crash

One person died and another was injured in a two-vehicle crash that closed Highway 26 Sunday morning.

An initial investigation found the driver of a 2006 Audi appears to have lost

control while traveling west-bound near milepost 13 and struck a 2009 Jeep Cherokee head-on.

The driver of the Audi, Jesus M. Ramirez-Cortes of Milwaukie, 19, was pronounced dead at the scene. The other driver, Sylvia L. Kearns of Vancouver, Washington, was sent to Provi-

dence Seaside Hospital to treat minor injuries.

Alcohol use is being considered as a contributing factor, according to Oregon State Police.

Highway 26 was shut down for about one hour then restricted for another three hours while the crash was being investigated.

Art studios, market coming to former food cart pod

Michael Bruhn is opening artist studios in the former Flourine & Co. beauty store, along with a weekend market and possible food carts in the parking lot at the corner of 11th and Duane streets.

Bruhn, a mechanic and hoist operator for Columbia River Bar Pilot transporter Brim Aviation who frames art on the weekends, said he acquired the property to help with his craft and plans to call

it Astoria Art Garden.

"I just kind of want to make it a gathering space for artists and food and stuff like that," he said. "I picked it up in a sheriff's auction. My plan is to organically grow it up and get as many people as possible."

The property had gone into foreclosure over unpaid taxes by the previous owner. Flourine & Co. closed in February, and several food carts in the parking lot dispersed.

Nourish Juice Bar has reopened in the Astor Hotel building on Commer-

cial Street. Good Bowl and Snackle Box plan to open their carts at the foot of 11th Street on the waterfront.

Bruhn's building includes several studio spaces between 200 and 400 square feet that he will rent out. He is coordinating with Astoria Makers to start an outdoor market in the parking lot featuring local artisans and craftspeople. The outdoor market would start around the same time as the Astoria Sunday Market, he said, and could expand to the parking lot around Bank of the Pacific.

New Wendy's planned in Warrenton

WARRENTON — A new Wendy's restaurant is being planned at the Warrenton Highlands shopping center.

Baysinger Partners Architecture submitted plans for a nearly 2,400-square-foot Wendy's in a small patch of field along Ensign Lane.

Wendy's has been rolling out smaller restaurant designs, enabling the company to open in spaces as small as one-quarter of an acre. The Warrenton location would include a narrow rectangular restaurant with seating for 40, an outdoor patio, a drive-through ringing the property and nine parking spots.

With more than 6,500 locations, Wendy's is one of the largest fast-food chains globally. During an investor meeting in February 2017, company

officials unveiled plans to open an additional 1,000 locations by 2020, including 500 more in North America, according to food service publication Nation's Restaurant News.

The North Coast Retail Center around the busy intersection of U.S. Highway 101 and Ensign Lane has become

a nexus of new development. A new Walmart is scheduled to open in June. A Domino's pizza restaurant, along with T-Mobile and Sprint phone stores, recently opened around the periphery of Costco. The complex also includes a newer Panda Express and Taco Bell restaurants.

Voter registration deadline approaching

The deadline to register for the May primary election is approaching.

Residents must register with the Clatsop County Clerk and Elections Office by 5 p.m. on April 24 to be eligible to vote May 15. Registrations can be handed into the office at 820 Exchange St. or postmarked by the deadline. Forms are available at the elections office, U.S. post offices, public libraries, state Department of Motor Vehicles offices or online through the Oregon

Secretary of State's office.

Residents are required to register if they wish to either vote for the first time or change their party affiliation, and the county has urged those who have moved to fill out the proper forms. The Independent Party of Oregon has opened its primary election for anyone who is not a member of a specific party. Those ballots must be requested through the county website or the elections office before the registration deadline.

Candidates are running for state House District 32, the 1st

Congressional District and three seats on the Clatsop County Board of Commissioners. Additionally, four tax levies — for the Lewis and Clark Rural Fire Department, Clatskanie Rural Fire Department, Warrenton Police Department and the Clatsop Care Health District — will also be on the ballot.

Ballots will be mailed out starting April 25. One voter pamphlet per each registered household will arrive before ballots are sent out. More information can be found at the county website or at (503) 325-8511.
